Roles

- Distinctness primary
 - Defines the variety (as grown under specified conditions)
- · Virtual reference collection
- Objections
- Infringement, EDV
- · Maintenance?



Distinctness

- · Provides an official description of the variety
 - grown under specified conditions
- · Amendments permitted before grant
- Amendments after grant are generally not permitted – very rare

Robust intellectual property rights delivered efficiently



AU descriptions include

- · Details of Application
- Details of Trial- location, time, treatment, number of plants, trial design
- · Origin and breeding of the variety
- Choice of most similar varieties of common knowledge
- · Variety description and distinctness claims
- · Photograph

Robust intellectual property rights delivered efficiently




Virtual reference collection

 Provides a resource for identifying potential existing varieties of common knowledge

Robust intellectual property rights delivered efficiently





Objections

 Publication of the description provides transparency and opportunity for a third party to object to an application for PBR before it is granted

Robust intellectual property rights delivered efficiently



Infringement/EDV

- Descriptions can play a role post grant in infringement cases usually in conjunction with other evidence
- · Descriptions play a role post grant in claims of EDV

Maintenance?

- Generally responsibility of grantee. But..
 - if challenged
 - significant TG changes
