# HARMONIZATION OF FEES

## Document prepared by the Office of the Union

1. During its third session (April 1975) the Committee of Experts on International Cooperation in Examination asked the experts from each member State to provide the Office of the Union, with a view to the preparation of a document, with detailed information on the cost of testing in that State and the calculation basis used. The Committee of Experts further specified the details which should be included in that information (see document ICE/III/8, paragraph 32).

2. Having received the first information from Sweden, the Office of the Union circulated this information to the other member States on June 17, 1975, with a reference to those States' agreement to provide similar information.

3. After four other member States had sent in their information, the Office of the Union compared the information received and realized that the figures given were in fact difficult to compare. The information was based partly on a given species (wheat), and partly on the yearly budget of the office for plant breeders' rights as a whole. Where the budget of the office as a whole was indicated, the overhead costs were sometimes given separately and sometimes included in the figures indicated for testing or administration. Neither was the cost of maintaining a granted right indicated in full. In some cases the figures for the total number of applications, withdrawals and rejections per year were missing.

4. In order to obtain figures that could be compared, the Office of the Union established a table for listing the information requested by the Committee. This table, which included all figures already available to the Office, was mailed, together with the information received from the four other member States besides Sweden, to all member States, with the request that the figures for the respective countries be filled in as far as possible, and that the table be mailed back to the Office of the Union in time to reach it at least two days before the fourth session of the Committee of Experts on November 4, 1975, to allow its inclusion in the present document. 5. Annex I to this document contains all the comparable information received so far. Table 1 quotes figures in the national currency of the respective member State while Table 2 indicates the corresponding figures in Swiss francs. For the purposes of comparison, the same exchange rates have been used as in document ICE/III/4 Rev. The exchange rates in question were those of April 7, 1975, and were as follows:

6. Among non-member States, Spain has informed the Office of the Union of the fees to be paid under its Plant Variety Protection Act of March 1975. This information is reproduced in Annex II to this document.

7. In addition to its comparison of the actual figures, the Committee of Experts might be interested in discussing the following subjects:

(a) Should the fee-structure be harmonized so as to comprise only application fees, testing fees and annual fees?

(b) Should overhead costs be taken into account when determining fees?

(c) Should part of the cost of the plant variety protection system be borne by the general public? Should the full cost be borne by the breeders?

(d) Should each fee cover the cost of the specific activity for which it is charged, or should the member States recover part of the costs incurred prior to the grant of the title out of the annual fees?

(e) What system should govern the charging of testing fees in the case of centralized testing or exchange of test results?

(f) Is the Committee able to agree on a harmonized fee for certain species, and if so for which species? If not, can agreement be reached on a range for the fees?

## REPORT ABOUT PLANT BREEDER'S RIGHT FEES CHARGED IN SPAIN

According with articles 26 th, and 27 th of our "Plant Variety Protection Act (March, 1975)" the total amount of fees for the different services are as follows:

"Article 26.-

For the purposes of the fees established in the last mentioned article, the plant species or groups thereof, subject to the protection established by this Act, are divided into the following groups:

First group: Cereals, oil seeds, lucerne, cotton, sugar and fodder beet, vetch, potato, peas, beans and broad beans.

Second group: Fruit trees, roses, carnations and straw berries.

Third group: Lettuce, tomato, onion, melon, sainfoin, red clover and white clover.

Fourth group: the other species not included in the - above mentioned groups.

"Article 27.-

A) These fees shall be paid for the services listed - hereunder, according to the types which are also included:
