SUMMARY

This document contains the draft program and budget of UPOV for 1977. The proposed budget provides for expenses amounting to 964,000 Swiss francs; approximately 97% of this amount would be covered by contributions payable by member States (933,000 Swiss francs) and the balance by miscellaneous income.

The Present Document:

- 1. The present document contains an Introduction and two Chapters followed by Annexes.
- (i) The <u>Introduction</u> contains, in particular, a comparison by budget heading of expenditure and income proposed for 1977 with the 1976 adopted budget;
- (ii) Chapter I (Summary of Budget) contains a Summary of Income and Expenditure proposed for 1977 with comparison to the 1976 adopted budget and also gives the actual figures for 1975;
- (iii) Chapter II (Program and Expenses) describes each activity proposed and gives its cost wherever applicable;
 - (iv) Annex A contains a description of the budget headings;
- (v) Annex B shows the amount of the contribution payable by each member State on the assumption that the total amount of contributions proposed in the present budget is adopted and on the basis of the present membership of UPOV.

INTRODUCTION

Budget headings:

- 2. The program will in essence have to be only a continuation of the work done in previous years though the necessity to hold a revision conference soon and other factors would have asked for the enlargement of certain activities. The Office has abstained from proposing any enlargement, and has even proposed cuts on certain items, in view of the fact that the budget for 1977 has probably again to be based on the contribution of only six member States as, until today, no further States have ratified the UPOV Convention or have acceded to it. Also, the budgetary situation in all member States is reported to be very serious. Under these circumstances, and as long as they last, the Office thinks it to be necessary to postpone any increase in the activities. The program will consist of the activities described in detail in Chapter II below.
- 3. The budget headings (described in Annex A) are the same as in the 1976 budget as far as income headings are concerned. As far as expenditure is concerned, they differ somewhat from those used in the 1976 budget. The changes are desirable to conform with the headings adopted by the International Bureau of WIPO in order to be as much in line as possible with the "objects of expenditure classification" developed through consultation among the United Nations System of organizations.

This heading increases by 65,000 francs. Of that amount 12,000 francs or 2.8% is due to a salary increase of approximately 13% granted, in the UN common system to staff belonging to the General Service category; 6,000 francs or 1.4% represent provision for "within grade" (that is, seniority caused) increases for staff continuing in service in 1977 (except the Secretary-General who does not have such an increase and the Vice Secretary-General who has such an increase every two years only); approximately 18,000 francs or 4.2% is due to provision for promotion of a staff member from P1 to P2; 15,000 francs or 3.5% is due to the change in the indemnity of the Secretary General (see item G, below) and approximately 22,000 francs or 5.0% represent provision for increases in the cost of living. These make up a total of 73,000 francs from which may be deducted some 8,000 francs or 1.9% representing slight overcostings in the 1976 budget.

The increase, $\underline{2,000}$ francs is modest and, in view of the expected increase in the cost of travel and hotels, it is foreseen that the number of missions in 1977 will probably be the same as, if not less than, in 1976.

The increase of 7,000 francs is mainly due to provision, in 1977, for interpretation in the session of the Committee of Experts for International Cooperation in Examination which the Council had decided, as an exceptional measure, not to provide for in the 1976 budget (5,000 francs). The remaining increase of 2,000 francs is due to the normal rise in the cost of interpretation and other expenses connected with servicing meetings.

The amount budgeted for 1977 is based on the experience of 1975.

(i) It should be noted that, although staff costs in the WIPO Budget for 1977 increase by 11.4%, the increase in this subhead reflected here is only 4.5%

(ii) The substantial increase in the cost of Maintenance of Premises is due to expenses connected with the move of the UPOV Office into the new WIPO Building (see paragraph 18(D)(b)(i)* and item SA.10 in the WIPO budget**). It must be reduced by 11,000 francs of receipts from UPOV's participation in the rental of the WIPO Old building left vacant after the move to the New building and included under "Miscellaneous Income" in the present draft budget.

Document AB/VII/2 (available in English and French only).

Paragraph 18(D)(b)(i) reads as follows:

[&]quot;From 342,000 francs in 1976, the expenses budgeted for under this heading increase to 1,468,000 francs in 1977, that is, by 1,126,000 francs. The amount for 1977 is calculated on the assumption that, in mid-1977, the present premises will be abandoned and the new building will be occupied. It is estimated that, for six months in 1977, the maintenance and running costs of the new building will amount to approximately 810,000 francs (insurances, 45,000; cleaning, 255,000; maintenance contracts for air-conditioning equipment, lifts, fire detectors, etc., 85,000; heating, 255,000; electricity and water, 170,000). In addition, the 1977 budget carries provision for the initial cleaning of the building and landscaping prior to occupation (270,000 francs), for the initial filling of fuel tanks (80,000 francs) and for an initial stock of spare parts (65,000 francs). Thus, the increase for 1977 due to the new building will be 1,225,000 francs, from which may be deducted some 100,000 francs savings on the mainteance cost of the present buildings for six months."

(iii) The increase in expenses of Communications (telephone and postage) are due, for the most part to the fact that postal rates and telephone charges have been sharply increased in Switzerland in 1976 and this was not reflected in the 1976 budget figure of 13,000 francs.

A. Contributions

It should be noted that, as indicated by the Secretary General when the budget for 1976 was presented and approved (see document C/IX/4, paragraph 29), the Reserve Fund is expected to be totally exhausted by the end of 1976. Consequently, and contrary to the budgets for 1976 and preceding years, it is necessary that all the expenses be covered from contributions (with the exception of the relatively small amount (31,000 francs) of miscellaneous income). These are calculated on the basis that the membership of the Union will be the same in 1977 as in 1976. It is recalled that when the budget for 1976 was approved the Council noted that "unless new member States adhere in the course of 1976, the increase of contributions between 1976 and 1977, with unchanged program, will be around 25%" (document C/IX/4, paragraph 29). According to the present draft budget it is 20.5%.

B. Miscellaneous

The increase is due to UPOV's participation in the rental of the WIPO Old building left vacant after the move into the new building (11,000 francs--see WIPO budget, Chapter I, page 19) and to the expected increase in the income from the sale of publications (7,000 francs in 1977 against 3,000 francs budgeted for in 1976).

7. The Council is invited to adopt the program and budget of the Union for the year 1977.

- (i) inform them, and discuss with them on, the objectives and activities of UPOV, especially on the items which will be the subject of the next Revision Conference of UPOV;
- (ii) learn about their activities and their position regarding UPOV and envisaged amendments of the UPOV Convention;
- (iii) institute, where appropriate, exchange of publications, mutual attendance of certain meetings, and other means of cooperation;
- (iv) hear the views of such organizations as to the priorities that ought to be fixed in the field of international cooperation concerning plant breeders' rights and as to other questions of mutual interest;
- (v) establish and maintain contacts with non-member States envisaging accession to the UPOV Convention.

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ANNEX A

BUDGET HEADINGS AND DEFINITIONS

A. INCOME

"Contributions"

Mandatory contributions payable by member States under Article 26 of the UPOV Convention.

"Miscellaneous"

All other income including bank interest and sales of brochures and newsletters.

B. OBJECTS OF EXPENDITURE

"Salaries & Common Staff Costs"

Basic salaries, post adjustments, non-resident allowances, dependency and language allowances, education grants, employer's contribution towards Pension Fund, participation in sickness and accident insurance scheme, recruitment costs, installation and removal expenses, and any other payments made to or on behalf of staff members under the Staff Rules and Regulations.

"Travel on Official Business"

 $\underline{\text{Missions}}$: travel expenses and daily subsistence allowances for the staff of the Office of the Union on official missions.

<u>Third Party Travel</u>: travel expenses and daily subsistence allowances (DSA) for persons other than the staff of the Office of the Union (except trainees whose travel and DSA are included under "Fellowships," below; except also travel of consultants, interpreters, etc., see below).

"Contractual Services"

<u>Conferences</u>: interpreters; translators; minute writers; renting of premises, offices, and simultaneous interpretation equipment; translation, reproduction and printing of documents made under contract; cost of engaging supernumeraries (telephonists, secretaries, ushers, and others); cost of carriage of documents; refreshments and receptions; other expenses connected with conferences. Travel of interpreters, translators, or other persons engaged specifically for a conference.

<u>Consultants</u>: All expenses connected with the employment of consultants, in particular: honorarium, travel and DSA.

<u>Printing</u>: Printing and binding outside WIPO, in particular: (i) reviews: paper and printing; (ii) other printing: reprints of articles published in reviews; brochures; treaties; collections of texts; manuals; working forms and other miscellaneous printed material.

Other: All other contractual services, in particular: fees of authors and translators of articles appearing in publications, fees of translators of documents (except those concerning conferences), rental of computer time and fees for producing computer software.

"General Operating Expenses"

Rental of premises: Rental value of premises which are used exclusively by the Office of the Union. (This item does not include the contribution of UPOV to the WIPO common expenses for the space occupied by the Common Services).

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<u>Maintenance of premises</u>: cleaning; repairs; building insurance; upkeep of park; supervision of installations; wages and insurance of cleaning staff; heating; lighting; water.

Rental and Maintenance of Equipment and Furniture: rental and maintenance of all equipment and furniture, in particular: office furniture and machines; reproduction equipment; data processing equipment; transportation equipment including petrol and lubricants.

<u>Communications</u>: cost of telephone, telegrams, telexes and mail, including installation, upkeep and rental of telephone equipment and sets; installation, upkeep and rental of telex machines; postage; carriage of documents (other than those concerning conferences).

Other: all general operating expenses not described above, in particular: hospitality; bank charges; interest on bank and other loans (except building loans); exchange losses; audit fees and expenses connected thereto.

"Supplies and Materials"

All supplies and materials, in particular: stationery and office supplies; internal reproduction supplies (offset, microfilms, etc.); library books and subscriptions to reviews and periodicals; uniforms; data processing supplies (magnetic tapes, cards, etc.).

"Acquisition of Furniture and Equipment"

Purchases of furniture and equipment, in particular: office furniture and office machines; data processing equipment; conferences servicing and reproducing equipment; transportation equipment.

"Acquisition and Improvement of Premises"

<u>New Buildings</u>: expenses directly connected with the acquisition or construction of buildings but not covered by building loans. Includes, in particular: additions to existing premises and purchase of land.

<u>Improvements to Premises</u>: expenses connected with the alterations, improvements or major maintenance of existing buildings not covered by building loans.

Amortization of Loans: repayment of loans originally obtained for New Buildings or Improvements as defined above, including interest on such loans.

"Fellowships"

Includes, in particular: travel, DSA and other expenses in connection with trainees.

"Other Expenses"

Expenses not specifically provided for above, unforeseen expenses and accounting adjustments (debits) in respect of prior years; expenses payable to WIPO for services rendered to UPOV.
