## INTRODUCTION

1. The International Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants is applicable, according to its Article 4(1), to all botanical genera and species. Its Article 4(2) provides that "the member States of the Union undertake to adopt all measures necessary for the progressive application of the provisions of this Convention to the largest possible number of botanical genera and species." This document surveys the measures for the protection of the various taxa\* that have been instituted by the member States of the Union and the States not yet members but signatories of the 1978 Revised Act of the Convention. It also contains additional information which may be useful in the context of this document.

2. This document contains the following parts:

- (i) a main table;
- (ii) notes classified by States;
- (iii) notes classified by taxa;
- (iv) three indexes of common names.

3. The main table contains the list of the taxa protected in at least one of the States defined above with, for each of them, indications with respect to its protection in each of the States. Explanations of the symbols used for this purpose appear on page 5.

4. The taxa are listed in the alphabetical order of their Latin names, except in the case of complex genera which contain many species and subspecies. These are isolated from the rest of the table by dotted lines and are treated differently, for instance with the use of titles, in order to facilitate consultation of the table.

5. The Latin names of the taxa are taken over from the rules and regulations of the member States protecting them, except in the following circumstances:

(i) The legislation of a member State may not contain Latin names and may therefore specify the protected taxa by means of their common names (in the case of France, Italy--with respect to certain taxa--Japan and Spain). Where relevant, the Office of the Union has added the Latin name corresponding to the common name.

(ii) The legislation of a member State may contain a Latin name the scope of which is much greater than that of the corresponding common name which defines the protected taxon. Where relevant, the Office of the Union has completed the Latin name.

(iii) Two or more States protecting the same taxon may use different Latin names. Two cases may exist:

(a) The differences are small (presence and absence of authors' names, different spellings, etc.): in this case, the Office of the Union has retained only one Latin name.

(b) The differences are substantial: where the difference relates to the use of synonyms (for example, *Prunus amygdalus* and *Amygdalus communis*), each designation is the subject of an entry in which the synonym is given in square brackets. Where the difference relates to the rank of the designations used and where, in practice, they cover about the same set of varieties (for example, *Hordeum L.* and *H. vulgare* to designate barley), these designations are the subject of one entry only in which one of them is given in square brackets.

6. For its decisions on the Latin names, the Office of the Union mainly had recourse to the following works:

(i) "Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas" by E. Sanchez Monje y Parellada - Ministerio de Agricultura, Servicio de Publicaciones Agrarias, Madrid;

(ii) "Dictionary of Gardening" (second edition (1977)) by P.M. Syng - Oxford University Press;

(iii) "ISTA List of Stabilized Plant Names" (first edition (1966)) and complementary list established by the Secretariat of ISTA and containing all names stabilized between 1966 and 1980;

(iv) "Zander - Handwörterbuch der Pflanzennamen" (tenth edition reviewed and completed by F. Encke and G. Buchheim), Eugen Ulmer Publications, Stuttgart, Federal Republic of Germany.

The species names stabilized by ISTA are preceded by an asterisk.

7. The common names originate from the national laws and regulations or have been indicated by the competent authorities of the member States, or again have been added by the Office of the Union. In this respect, three types of common names may be distinguished:

(i) true common names (examples: wheat, onion, apple, carnation, poplar);

(ii) common names deriving from the corresponding Latin name or from which the Latin name is derived (examples: abutilon, acacia, chrysanthemum, dahlia);

(iii) Latin names which, in the absence of true common names, are used in the common language (examples: Cymbidium, Dieffenbachia, Romneya). Such names may also co-exist with a true common name (example: Anthurium and Tail Flower). As time passes, they may pass into the common language as names of the second type (example: Gerbera). These names may be the subject of some changes, of which the most important are phonetic or spelling adaptations (addition of accents in French, change of the last syllable, -ia becoming for example -ie in German, etc.) and total or partial translations (for example Abies sachalinensis becomes "Sachalin Fir" and Pelargonium peltatum becomes "Ivy-leaved Pelargonium"). The result is that several variants may be used in one and the same language. Variants may also exist for other reasons. It should be noted in particular that the spelling of compound names is not always consistent in English (example: meadowgrass, meadow-grass and meadow grass).

8. Where relevant, the Office of the Union has added common names of the third type, thereby choosing those which seemed or were likely to prevail in usage. Concerning ornamental species, it is frequent usage to designate them, in the absence of names of the first or second type, by the name of the genus. Thus the species Allamanda cathartica is designated by "Allamanda." This usage also prevails in the case of certain genera containing several ornamental species. In that case, in order to reduce the list, the Office of the Union has regrouped in one entry all species concerned where this was possible. Thus, Abutilon megapotamicum, A. X milleri, A. ochsenii and A. vitifolium are the subject of one entry only.

9. Attention is drawn to the fact that the relationships between common names and Latin names may be different from one taxon to another: in the case of the genera for instance, the common name may apply either to the whole of the species of the genus, or to certain species only. In the case of Viola, for instance, violet applies to the whole of the genus, on the one hand, and more particularly to the small flowered species on the other hand, the large flowered garden plants being called pansies. The main table and the indexes should therefore not be used without care as glossaries.

10. As the above indications show, the drawing up of the synoptical list of protected taxa has led to some departures from the relevant national laws and regulations, in particular because nomenclatures used are not uniform. In this respect, useful information is given in the "notes." In any case, it is recommended to consult these laws and regulations when precise information is needed.

11. The notes classified by States follow the alphabetical order of the codes applicable to countries. The following will be found therein, wherever it has appeared necessary:

(i) general notes relating in particular to the way in which the national list of protected taxa has been established;

(ii) special notes relating to a peculiarity of the national list which concerns a given taxon.

12. The notes classified by taxa contain more detailed information on systematics, notably on the synonyms.

13. The indexes of common names contain alphabetical lists of the common names mentioned in the main table with, opposite each of them, the Latin name of the corresponding genus. The compound common names are the subject of a double entry, as far as this is necessary, for example "Maidenhair Fern" and "Fern (Maidenhair)." In general, common names identical or very similar to Latin names do not appear in the indexes, neither do species names where they contain the name of the corresponding genus.

14. Unless otherwise indicated, the protection of a fruit crop taxon means that both fruiting varieties and rootstocks may be protected.

Ribes L.: the definition of the protected entities is the following (*ibid.*): "Currants, gooseberry and hybrids of those species."

**Special Notes**

Rosa L.: protection is limited to ornamental varieties (Ordinance of May 11, 1977, on Plant Variety Protection - Amendment of November 7, 1979).

Rubus idaeus L.: ornamental varieties are excluded from protection (*ibid.*).

Vitis L.: ornamental varieties are excluded from protection (*ibid.*).

**DE/GERMANY (FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF)**

**Special Notes**

Ribes L.: the definition of the protected entities is the following (Order of June 26, 1978, Concerning the List of Species under the Plant Variety Protection Law): "Currants [Johannisbeere], gooseberry [Stachelbeere], excluding ornamental varieties."

Rubus L.: the definition of the protected entities is the following (*ibid.*): "Blackberry, raspberry, excluding ornamental varieties."

Vitis L.: ornamental varieties are excluded from protection (*ibid.*).

**DK/DENMARK\***

**General Notes**

Protected taxa defined by genera: it is stated for the following genera, identified by the figure I in the main table, that all species are protected: Agrostis, Cydonia, Festuca, Lolium, Poa, Thuja. Concerning Cydonia, see also the special note below.

\* Unless otherwise indicated, the source is the Order of the Ministry of Agriculture No. 386 of July 24, 1975, on Plant Variety Protection (List of Species).

Rootstocks of fruit crops: rootstocks may be protected in the case of the following fruit crops, identified by the figure 2 in the main table: *Malus*, *Prunus avium*, *P. cerasus*, *P. domestica*. Their protection is not provided for in the case of the following woody fruit crops, identified by the figure 3 (it being understood that grafting is not in use for some of them): *Cydonia*, *Pyrus*, *Ribes*, *Rubus*, *Vaccinium*. Concerning *Cydonia*, see the special note below.

#### Special Notes

*Brassica rapa L. var. rapa (L.) Thell.*: the definition of the protected entities is the following:

- (i) *Brassica rapa L. var. rapa (L.) Thell.* - majroe (common name more particularly applicable to early garden turnips);
- (ii) *Brassica rapa L. var. rapifera* - turnips (common name more particularly applicable to fodder turnips).

The combination of these two entries corresponds to what the majority of States designate by the name *Brassica rapa var. rapa*. It is to be noted that certain works use "var. *rapifera*" as if it were a synonym of "var. *rapa*."

*Cydonia Mill.*: it is stated that all species may be protected; protection of rootstocks is not provided for.

*Epiphyllopsis Berger, Rhipsalidopsis Britt. et Rose, Schlumbergera Lem., Zygocactus K. Schum.*: the definition of the protected taxon is the following (Order of the Ministry of Agriculture No. 436 of August 26, 1981, Concerning the Protection of the Rights of the Breeders of Novelties of *Zygocactus K. Schum.*, *Schlumbergera Lem.*, *Rhipsalidopsis Britt. et Rose*, *Epiphyllopsis Berger* ([literally: cactus with jointed stems]) and their Hybrids): "*Zygocactus K. Schum.*, *Schlumbergera Lem.*, *Rhipsalidopsis Britt. et Rose*, *Epiphyllopsis Berger* ([literally: cactus with jointed stems]), comprising [literally: November] and Christmas Cactus, including Easter and [literally: Whitsun] Cactus) and their hybrids."

*Pelargonium L'Hér. ex Ait.*: the definition of the protected taxon is the following: "*Pelargonium L'Hér.* (including *P. X domesticum* L.H. Bail.; *P. X hortorum* L.H. Bail. and *P. X peltatum* (L.) Ait.) - pelargonium."

#### GB/UNITED KINGDOM

##### General Notes

Legal form of the extension of protection: protection is extended to a taxon by means of statutory instruments entitled "The Plant Breeders' Rights ([designation of the purpose of the instrument]) Scheme [year]" (example: "The Plant Breeders' Rights (Barley) Scheme 1965"). There is now a tendency to establish instruments relating to groups of plants. Thus, the aforementioned instrument has been repealed by "The Plant Breeders' Rights (Cereals) Scheme 1980," which states by name the protected cereals.

Definition of the protected entity: the precise definition of what may be protected is in general the following: "all plant varieties of [(i) common name of the taxon, or (ii) collective designation of the group of taxa] which conform with the characteristics of cultivated plant varieties of [(i) designation of the rank of the taxon and Latin name thereof, or (ii) designation of the ranks of the taxa concerned and reference to a table containing the list of the Latin names of those taxa and the corresponding common names]."

Herbaceous perennial plants and trees, shrubs and woody climbers: the technique of the collective statutory instruments has been used in particular for two groups of taxa which are identified in the main table because of the limitation of the scope of the Latin names of the taxa deriving from the collective designation:

(i) the taxa protected under "The Plant Breeders' Rights (Herbaceous Perennials) Scheme 1969" - figure 1: the only varieties which may be protected under that instrument are those which are herbaceous and hardy under the climate of the United Kingdom;

(ii) the taxa protected under "The Plant Breeders' Rights (Trees, Shrubs and Woody Climbers) Scheme 1969" as amended in 1971 - figure 2: the only varieties which may be protected within a taxon specified under that instrument are varieties of trees, shrubs and woody climbers. Concerning the following species, protection under that instrument has been limited to ornamental varieties by the amendment of 1971: *Prunus* L., *Pyrus* L., *Ribes* L., *Rubus* L., *Vaccinium* L.

Rootstocks of fruit crops: in the case of woody fruit crops, account is taken of the fact that fruiting varieties and rootstock varieties do not always belong to the same species. In the main table, the "X" indicating that the taxon is protected is placed alongside the fruiting species and is accompanied by the figure 3. The scope of protection of each fruit crop is specified in the following table.

*Chrysanthemum* L. partim: the reference to the taxon concerned is: "all plant varieties of perennial chrysanthemums which conform with the characteristics of cultivated plant varieties of the genus *Chrysanthemum* of the following species or groups:

*C. sinense* Sabine; *C. chinense* hort.; *C. hortorum* W. Mill.;

*C. makinoi* Matsum. and Nakai; *C. sibiricum* (DC.) Fischer ex Turcz;  
*C. zawadskii* Herbich and varieties; *C. rubellum* Sealy (*C. erubescens* hort. non Stapf); *C. cuneifolium* Kitamura; *C. okiense* Kitamura;  
*C. boreale* (Makino); *C. aphrodite* Kitamura; *C. arcticum* auct. non L.;

*Brassica rapa* L. var. *rapa* (L.) Thell.: protection has been extended to this taxon under "The Plant Breeders' Rights (Vegetables) (including Field Beans and Field Peas) Scheme 1980," but it is to be noted that Turnip is often grouped with the vegetables.

*Lupinus* L.: this taxon is protected under both statutory instruments mentioned in the paragraph "Herbaceous perennial plants and trees, shrubs and woody climbers."

*Oenothera* L.: this taxon is protected under "The Plant Breeders' Rights (Herbaceous Perennials) Scheme 1969" and under "The Plant Breeders' Rights (Oil and Fibre Plants) Scheme 1980," the latter not applying to ornamental varieties.

*Paeonia* L.: this taxon is protected under both statutory instruments mentioned in the paragraph "Herbaceous perennial plants and trees, shrubs and woody climbers."

*Zea mays* L.: protection does not extend to varieties of sweetcorn and popcorn.

#### JP/JAPAN

##### General Notes

The list of protected taxa appears in the implementing regulations to the revised Seeds and Seedlings Law (Cabinet Order No. 391 of December 22, 1978). That list was extended by virtue of a Cabinet Order of October 16, 1981. It is divided into eight groups, identified by the figures 1 to 8 in the main table. The groups bear no titles, but the following may be given:

- Group 1: "agricultural" plants
- Group 2: vegetables
- Group 3: fruit crops
- Group 4: fodder plants
- Group 5: herbaceous ornamental plants
- Group 6: woody ornamental plants
- Group 7: aquatic plants
- Group 8: mushrooms.

Each group is subdivided into genera, species and sub-species. The subdivisions are not identified at all in the main table, because they are readily recognizable in most cases from the Latin names.

The inclusion of the name of a taxon in one of the eight groups has no limitative effect on the scope of the name (for example, the fact that *Camellia L.* is listed in Group 6 does not exclude *Tea* (*Camellia sinensis (L.) O. Kuntze*) from protection). The inclusion in a subdivision of a name denoting a taxon of a lower rank than that of the subdivision concerned also has no limitative effect (for example, the Japanese name equivalent to "cherry, flowering cherry" is mentioned in the subdivision "Genera" of Group 3, but the whole genus *Prunus*--and not the subgenus *Cerasus* only--is covered).

#### Special Notes

Brassica napus L., Brassica rapa L.: Protection is provided for in respect of Rape (*Brassica napus L. partim*; Oilseed Rape) and Japanese local types (*Brassica campestris L.*--synonymous with *B. rapa L.*--*partim*; leaf vegetable varieties), and also Turnip (*Brassica rapa L.*--including fodder varieties).

#### NL/NETHERLANDS

##### General Notes

A special protection regime is provided for in respect of certain taxa--identified by the figure 1 in the main table--by Section 85 of the Seeds and Planting Materials Act: pursuant to that section, reproductive material of a registered variety may only be commercialized, offered for sale or exported by the breeder and by any person who has obtained from the breeder foundation stock suitable for the production of reproductive material.

##### Special Notes

Bromeliaceae, Aechmea, Cryptanthus, Guzmania, Neoregelia, Tillandsia, Vriesea: the definition of the protected entities is the following (Order of December 15, 1980 (Staatsblad 773) amending the Plant Breeders' Rights Order of 1975): "Plants of the Bromelia type, provided that they belong to one of the genera mentioned [above] or to a hybrid between them."

#### NZ/NEW ZEALAND

##### General Notes

New Zealand protects the following (Plant Varieties Act Extension Order 1981 (No. 297)):

"All varieties and species of plants other than fungi, algae, and bacteria."

#### SE/SWEDEN

##### General Notes

The list of protected taxa is divided into two chapters, of which the second is subdivided into three groups, as follows:

- A. Agricultural Crops (figure 1 in the main table)
- B. Horticultural Crops
  - 1 - Vegetables (figure 2)
  - 2 - Fruit Crops (figure 3)
  - 3 - Ornamental Plants (figure 4)

Concerning the fruit crops, protection of rootstocks is provided for in respect of *Malus*, *Prunus*, *Pyrus* and *Ribes*, but not in respect of *Rubus* and *Vaccinium*.

Special Notes

Brassica napus L. var. rapa (L.) Thell.: the protected taxon appears in the group of agricultural crops under the name of "Brassica rapa L. var. rapifera Metzg. - Rova."

Brassica napus L. var. napobrassica (L.) Rchb.: this taxon appears both in the agricultural crops group and in the vegetables group.

Phaseolus vulgaris L.: this taxon appears both in the agricultural crops group and in the vegetables group.

Pisum sativum L.: this taxon appears both in the agricultural crops group and in the vegetables group.

Zea mays L.: this taxon appears both in the agricultural crops group and in the vegetables group.

US/UNITED STATES OF AMERICAGeneral Notes

The United States of America protects:

(i) all sexually reproduced plant varieties excluding fungi, bacteria and first generation hybrids (Section 42(a) of the Plant Variety Protection Act);

(ii) all vegetatively propagated plant varieties, including cultivated sports, mutants, hybrids, and newly found seedlings, other than tuber propagated plants [in practice, Irish potato and Jerusalem artichoke] and plants found in an uncultivated state (Section 161 of the Patent Law).

It has not yet been judicially determined whether plant varieties not protectable under section 161 of the patent laws, including varieties of Irish potatoes and Jerusalem artichokes, as well as hybrid varieties, are eligible for protection under the general patent laws.

## NOTES CLASSIFIED BY TAXA

A botanical nomenclature is not an absolute system, mainly because nature cannot be reduced to such a system. Determining the taxonomic rank which should be given to a certain type of plant, defining the borders of a genus or a species, classifying a species within a genus, all these involve some degree of arbitrary judgement, and thus a risk that different decisions may be taken. This arbitrary element is a source of synonymies, as also is the progress of knowledge when it results in a critical re-examination of earlier decisions.

A list is given below of taxa mentioned in the main table and of their synonyms found mainly in the Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas, in the Dictionary of Gardening and in Zander (see the introduction to this document). Although certain of these synonyms are today no more than curiosities, having fallen into disuse, others still have a definite importance, being used in scientific works and in practice, notably in commerce. Where relevant, the problems arising from nomenclature are briefly explained. Attention is drawn to the fact that it is the responsibility of the competent authorities of States to define with precision what is covered by a particular denomination for the purposes of plant variety protection.

Abelia R. Br.: synonymies with\* *Linnaea*.

Abelmoschus esculentus (L.) Moench: syn.: *Hibiscus esculentus* L., the latter being stabilized by ISTA.

Abies Mill.: synonymies with *Ketcleeria*, *Larix*, *Picea*, *Pinus*, *Pseudolarix*, *Pseudotsuga*, *Tsuga*.

Abies sachalinensis (Fr. Schmidt) Mast.: the variety *nemorensis* has the synonyms *A. nemorensis*, *A. wilsonii*.

Abutilon megapotamicum St.-Hil. et Naud.: syn.: *A. vexillarium* E. Morr.

Abutilon X milleri hort. = *A. megapotamicum* X *A. pictum*.

Acacia Mill.: synonymies with *Albizia*, *Leucaena*, *Mimosa*.

Acer L.: certain species have also been grouped into a genus Negundo. *A. septemlobum* Thunb. is a synonym of *Kalopanax septemlobus* (Thunb.) Koidz. (*K. pictus* (Thunb.) Koidz. ex Rehd., *Acanthopanax ricinifolius* (Sieb. et Zucc.) Seem.).

Achillea L.: synonymies with *Anthemis*, *Tanacetum*.

Adiantum L.: *A. adiantoides* (*A. hewardia*) has the synonym *Hewardia adiantoides*.

Aechmea Ruiz et Pav.: numerous synonymies, notably with *Androlepis*, *Billbergia*, *Bromelia*, *Canistrum*, *Chevaliera*, *Echinostachys*, *Gravisia*, *Hohenbergia*, *Hoplophytum*, *Lamprococcus*, *Macrochordium*, *Nidularium*, *Ortgiesia*, *Pironneava*, *Portea*, *Pothuava*, *Quesnelia*, *Streptocalyx*, *Wittmackia*.

Aërides Lour.: see under *Orchidaceae*. Synonymies with *Ascocentrum*, *Ornithochilus*, *Rhynchostylis*, *Saccolabium*, *Sarcanthus*, *Vanda*.

Aesculus L.: synonymies with *Pavia*.

Agaricus L.: synonymies with *Pratella*, *Psalliota*.

\* The expression "synonymies with" means that subdivisions of the taxon concerned have synonyms in the taxa indicated, and vice versa. In the case of the genus *Abelia*, for instance, a number of species thereof have also been described under the name *Linnaea*.

Ageratum L.: *A. corymbosum* has the synonym *Caelestina ageratooides* and *A. lasseauxii* has the synonym *Eupatorium lasseauxii*.

Agrostis L.: synonymies with *Achnatherum*, *Aira*, *Apera*, *Oryzopsis*, *Zoysia*.

Agrostis gigantea Roth: syn.: *A. alba* auct. p.p. non L.

Agrostis stolonifera L.: syn.: *A. alba* auct. p.p. non L. According to ISTA, this species includes *A. palustris* Huds.

Agrostis tenuis Sibth.: syn.: *A. vulgaris* With.

Albizia julibrissin Durazz.: syn.: *A. nemu*.

Allamanda cathartica L.: syn.: *A. aubletii*, *A. linnaei*, *Orelia grandiflora*. Certain botanical varieties have also been made into species (*A. grandiflora* Hook., *A. hendersonii* Bull (*A. wardleyana*), *A. nobilis* T. Moore, *A. schottii* Pohl, *A. williamsii*).

Allium L.: *A. fragrans* is a synonym of *Nothoscordon inodorum*.

Allium ascalonicum L.: *A. ascalonicum* Lour. is a synonym of *A. fistulosum* L.

Allium bakeri Regel: *A. bakeri* Hoop. is a synonym of *A. fistulosum* L.

Allium cepa L.: *A. cepa* Lour. is a synonym of *A. fistulosum* L.

Allium fistulosum L.: syn.: *A. ascalonicum* Lour., *A. bakeri* Hoop., *A. cepa* Lour., *A. porrum* Debeaux.

Allium porrum L.: syn.: *A. ampeloprasum* porrum. *A. porrum* Debeaux is a synonym of *A. fistulosum* L.

Allium sativum L.: *A. sativum* L. var. *ophioscorodon* (Link) Döll has the synonyms *A. controversum* Schrad., *A. ophioscorodon* Link, *A. scorodoprasum* Lam.

Allium schoenoprasum L.: syn.: *A. sibiricum* L. (according to the Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas). The variety *sibiricum* has also been made into a species under the name *A. sibiricum* (according to the Dictionary of Gardening).

Allium tuberosum Rottl. ex Spreng.: syn.: *A. angulosum* Lour. non L., *A. Chinense* Maxim., *A. senescens* Miq. non L., *A. odorum* partim (according to the Dictionary of Gardening), *A. odorum* L. (according to the Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas), *A. tuberosum* Roxb.

Alnus Mill.: certain species have also been classified in the genus *Betula*.

Alocasia (Schott) G. Don: synonymies with *Arum*, *Caladium*, *Colocasia*, *Cyrtosperma*, *Schizocasia*.

Aloë spec.: synonymies with *Apicra*, *Astroloba*, *Gasteria*, *Haworthia*, *Sansevieria*.

Althaea rosea (L.) Cav.: syn.: *Alcea rosea* L.

Amaranthus tricolor L.: syn.: *A. melancholicus* L., *A. gangeticus* L. (according to Zander), *A. gangeticus* L., *A. mangostanus* L. (according to the Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas). According to the Dictionary of Gardening, *A. tricolor* is a botanical variety of *A. melancholicus*.

Amelanchier Medik.: *A. canadensis* (L.) Medik. has the synonym *Mespilus canadensis* L.

Amorphophallus rivieri Durieu: syn.: *Hydrosme rivieri* (Durieu) Engl., *Proteinophallus rivieri*.

Ampelopsis hort.: synonymies with *Cissus*, *Parthenocissus*, *Vitis*.

Ananas comosus (L.) Merr.: syn.: *Bromelia ananas* L., *B. comosa* L., *B. comosa* Stickm., *A. sativus* (Lindl.) Schult. f., *Ananassa sativa* Lindl.

Anchusa angustissima K. Koch: syn.: *A. caespitosa* hort. non Lam.

Anchusa italicica Retz.: syn.: A. azurea auct. non Mill.

Andromeda L.: many species now classified in the genera Arcterica, Cassiope, Chamaedaphne, Enkianthus, Gaultheria, Leucothoë, Iyonia, Oxydendrum, Pernettya, Pieris, Phyllodoce, Vaccinium and Zenobia are still listed and commercialized under the name Andromeda.

Anemone L.: synonymies with Anemonella, Hepatica and Pulsatilla.

Anemone hupehensis Lemoine: A. hupehensis (Lemoine) Lemoine has the synonym A. japonica (Thunb.) Sieb. et Zucc. var. hupehensis Lemoine. Its botanical variety japonica (Thunb.) Bowles et Stearn has the synonyms A. japonica (Thunb.) Sieb. et Zucc. non Houtt. and A. nipponica Merr. A. hupehensis var. tomentosa (Maxim.) Hyl. is a synonym of A. tomentosa (Maxim.) Pe'i (A. vitifolia Buch.-Ham. var. tomentosa (Maxim.) Ulbr.). A.-Japonica-Hybrids is a denomination which according to Zander covers the hybrids of A. hupehensis var. japonica and of A. vitifolia and which has notably the synonym A. X elegans Decne. Concerning A. elegans, the Dictionary of Gardening refers to A. hupehensis.

Anethum graveolens L.: syn.: A. sowa Roxb., Peucedanum graveolens.

Angraecum Bory: see under Orchidaceae. This genus comprises the following sections, which have also been made into genera by certain authors: Aerangis, Angraecum (in the restricted sense), Caliptrochilum, Cyrtorchis, Diaphananthe, Eurychone, Jumellea, Leptocentrum, Microcoelia, Mystacidium, Neofinetia, Tridactyle. In Zander and "Orchid care - A guide to cultivation and breeding" (Walter Richter - Studio Vista, London), Angraecum is considered in the restricted sense. In the Dictionary of Gardening, it is considered in the wide sense. The latter records further synonymies with: Aeonia (Oenia), Aeranthus, Angraecopsis, Dendrophylax, Listrostachis, Saccolabium.

Annona squamosa L.: syn.: A. asiatica L.

Anthemis L.: synonymies with Achillea, Anacyclus, Chrysanthemum, Cladanthus.

Anthriscus cerefolium (L.) Hoffm.: syn.: Chaerophyllum sativum, Scandix cerefolium L.

Anthurium Schott: synonymies with Philodendron, Pothos, Spathiphyllum.

Aquilegia L.: A. ecalcarata Maxim. is a synonym of Semiaquilegia ecalcarata (Maxim.) Sprague et Hutchins.

Arachis hypogaea L.: syn.: A. nambyquarae Hoehne.

Aralia elata (Miq.) Seem.: syn.: Dimorphanthus elatus Miq., D. mandshuricus (Maxim.) Maxim. et Rupr., A. mandshurica Maxim., A. chinensis L. var. mandshurica (Maxim.) Rehd.

Arbutus L.: synonymies with Arctostaphylos (Arbutus uva-ursi L. and Arctostaphylos uva-ursi (L.) Spreng.) and Pernettya (A. furiens and P. furiens).

Arctium lappa L.: syn.: Lappa major Gaertn.

Arctostaphylos Adans.: synonymies with Arbutus, Arctous, Mairrania, Uva-ursi.

Ardisia crispa A. DC.: syn.: Bladhia crispa Thunb. According to the Dictionary of Gardening, A. crispa has the synonyms A. crenata, A. crenulata, A. elegans. According to Zander, A. crenata Sims (A. crenulata Lodd.) is not A. crispa (Thunb.) A. DC.

Armeria (DC.) Willd.: synonymies with Statice.

Armoracia rusticana Gaertn., Mey. et Scherb.: syn.: A. lapathifolia Gilib., A. sativa Bernh., Cochlearia armoracia L., Raphanis magna Moench.

Aronia Medik.: synonymies with Mespilus, Pyrus, Sorbus.

Arrhenatherum elatius (L.) Beauv. ex J. et C. Presl: syn.: A. avenaceum Beauv., Avena elatior L.

Artemisia L.: *A. laxa* (Lam.) Fritsch has the synonym *Absinthium laxum* Lam.

Asclepias L.: synonymies with *Cynanchum*, *Gomphocarpus*, *Hoya*, *Xysmalobium*.

Ascocentrum Schlechter: see under *Orchidaceae*. Synonymies with *Saccolabium*, a genus of which *Ascocentrum* is a section when it is taken in the wide sense.

Asparagus plumosus Bak.: syn.: *A. setaceus* (Kunth) Jessop, *Asparagopsis setacea* Kunth.

Aspidistra elatior Bl.: syn.: *A. lurida* hort. non Ker-Gawl., *A. punctata*.

Aster L.: synonymies recorded in Zander with *Bellidiastrum*, *Calimeris* (Kali-*meris*), *Callistephus*, *Crinitaria*, *Felicia*, *Lynosyris*, *Microglossa*. According to the Dictionary of Gardening, "many attempts have been made to separate groups of this large genus as distinct genera and some have gained a recognized place, but the following seems scarcely distinct enough to warrant separation and are here regarded as forming part of the genus *Aster*: *Bellidiastrum*, *Calimeris*, *Doellingeria*, *Eucephalus*, *Galatella*, *Ionactis*, *Leucelene*, *Machaeranthera*, *Oreostemma*, *Xylorrhiza*." Synonymies with the following genera have also been recorded in the Dictionary of Gardening: *Biota*, *Boltonia*, *Diplopappus*, *Erigeron*, *Inula*.

Astilbe Buch.-Ham. ex D. Don: synonymies with *Hoteia*, *Spiraea*.

Aulax spec.: synonymies with *Protea*.

Avena L.: synonymies with *Arrhenatherum*, *Avenula*, *Helictotrichon*, *Trisetum*.

Avena nuda L.: *A. strigosa* Schreb. is a synonym of *A. nuda* L. ssp. *nuda* (*A. strigosa* Schreb. ssp. *strigosa* (Schreb.) Mansf.).

Babiana stricta (Ait.) Ker-Gawl.: the botanical variety *sulphurea* has also been named *Gladiolus sulphureus* and *G. plicatus*.

Belamcanda chinensis (L.) DC.: syn.: *Pardanthus chinensis* (L.) Ker-Gawl., *Gemmungia chinensis* (L.) O. Kuntze, *B. punctata* Moench, *Ixia chinensis* L.

Benincasa hispida (Thunb.) Cogn.: syn.: *B. cerifera* Savi, *Cucurbita hispida* Thunb., *C. pepo* Lour., *Lagenaria siceraria* (Mol.) Standl. var. *hispida* (Thunb.) Hara.

Berberis L.: The mahonias, with pinnate leaves, have been separated from *berberis*, with entire leaves, but can still be found under the name *berberis*.

Bergenia Moench: synonymies with *Megasea*, *Saxifraga*.

Beta vulgaris L. ssp. *vulgaris* var. *vulgaris*: syn.: *B. cycla* L.

Betula L.: certain species now form the genus *Alnus*.

Bletilla Rchb. f.: see under *Orchidaceae*. Synonymies with *Arethusa*, *Bletia*. *B. striata* has also been named *Cymbidium hyacinthinum*.

Boltonia asteroides (L.) L'Hér.: syn. *B. glastifolia* (Hill) L'Hér. *B. latisquama* A. Gray is a synonym of *B. asteroides* var. *latisquama* (A. Gray) Cronq.

Bougainvillea spectabilis Willd.: syn.: *Josepha augusta*. According to the Dictionary of Gardening, forms of this species have also been named *B. bracteata*, *B. brasiliensis*, *B. peruviana*, *B. splendens*. In Zander, *B. peruviana* Humb. et Bonpl. is considered a species. The variety 'Mrs Butt' has also been classified in a species *B. buttiana* (cf. *Encyclopédie des plantes d'appartement* - M. Schubert and R. Héwig - Denoël).

Brassavola R. Br.: see under *Orchidaceae*. Synonymies with *Epidendrum*, *Laelia*, *Rhyncholaelia*.

Brassica juncea (L.) Czern. et Coss. in Czern.: syn.: B. besseriana Andr., B. integrifolia (West.) Rupr., B. japonica Sieb., Sinapis integrifolia West., Sinapis juncea L.

Brassica napus L. var. napobrassica (L.) Rchb.: syn.: B. campestris L. var. napobrassica DC., B. napo-brassica Mill.

Brassica nigra (L.) W. Koch: syn.: B. juncea Sickenb., Sinapis nigra L.

Brassica pekinensis (Lour.) Rupr.: syn.: B. cernua (Thunb. ex Murray) Forb. et Hemsl., B. pētsai L.H. Bail., Sinapis pekinensis Lour. According to the Dictionary of Gardening, this is perhaps a cultivated form of B. integrifolia. The common name "Chinese cabbage" and its equivalents in the other languages is also used for B. chinensis L.

Bromus arvensis L.: B. arvensis Poll. non L. is a synonym of B. erectus Huds.

Buddleja L.: B. indica Lam. is a synonym of Nicodemia diversifolia Ten.

Buddleja madagascariensis Lam.: syn.: B. heterophylla Lindl.

Caladium bicolor (Ait.) Vent.: syn.: Arum bicolor Ait. The botanical varieties have also been made into species (C. argyrospilum, C. baraquini, C. brongniartii, C. chantinii, C. devosianum, C. leopoldii, C. macrophyllum, C. neumannii, C. regale, C. rubrivenium).

Calanthe R. Br.: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with Bletia, Limatodes.

Calathea G.F.W. Mey.: synonymies with Maranta, name under which many Calatheas are commercialized, Phrynium, Thalia. C. allouia is known in certain languages as Topinambour.

Calceolaria L.: the species of the genus Jovellana are frequently included in the genus Calceolaria.

Callicarpa purpurea Juss.: syn.: C. dichotoma (Lour.) K. Koch, C. japonica Thunb. var. angustifolia Sav., C. gracilis, C. koreana.

Callistemon R. Br.: synonymies with Metrosideros.

Callistephus chinensis (L.) Nees: syn.: Aster chinensis L.

Calluna vulgaris (L.) Hull: syn.: Erica vulgaris L.

Camelina sativa (L.) Crantz: syn.: Myagrum sativum L.

Camellia L.: Thea sinensis is frequently included in the genus Camellia under the names Camellia sinensis (L.) O. Kuntze (name stabilized by ISTA), C. thea Link, C. theifera Griff., C. bohea.

Camellia japonica L.: syn.: Thea japonica Baill.

Camellia sasanqua Thunb.: syn.: Thea sasanqua Nois.

Campanula L.: synonymies with Adenophora, Asyneuma, Azorina, Canarina, Edraianthus, Legousia, Phyteuma, Platycodon, Symphyandra, Wahlenbergia.

Campsip Lour.: synonymies with Bignonia, Tecoma.

Cannabis sativa L.: according to Zander the form 'Gigantea' (var. chinensis (Del.) A. DC.) has the synonym C. gigantea hort. According to the Dictionary of Gardening, C. gigantea and C. sativa are synonyms.

Carica papaya L.: syn.: Papaya carica.

Carpinus L.: two species have been separated by certain botanists from the genus Carpinus to form the genus Distegocarpus (C. cordata (D. cordata) and C. japonica (D. carpinus)).

Carya illinoiensis (Wangenh.) C. Koch: syn.: C. oliviformis (Michx.) Nutt., Hicoria pecan (Marsh.) Britt., C. pecan (Marsh.) Engl. et Graebn. non (Walt.) Nutt., Juglans illinoiensis Wangenh.

Caryopteris incana (Thunb. ex Houtt.) Miq.: syn.: C. mastacanthus Schau., C. sinensis (Lour.) Dipp., C. tangutica Maxim., Mastacanthus sinensis.

Cassiope D. Don: synonymies with Harriemanella. The species of this genus have also been classified in Andromeda and may still be commercialized under that name.

Castanea Mill.: synonymies with Castanopsis, Fagus, Fagus-castanea.

Cataranthus roseus (L.) G. Don: syn.: Vinca rosea L., Lochnera rosea (L.) Rchb.

Cattleya Lindl.: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with Encyclia, Epidendrum, Laelia, Schomburgkia, Sobralia, Sophronitis.

Ceanothus L.: C. asiaticus L. is a synonym of Colubrina asiatica (L.) Brongn.

Cenchrus ciliaris L.: syn.: Pennisetum ciliare (L.) Link.

Centaurea L.: synonymies with Aetheopappus, Amberboa, Cnicus, Rhaponticum.

Ceratostigma plumbaginoides Bunge: syn.: Plumbago larpentae Lindl., Valora-dia plumbaginoides.

Chaenomeles Lindl.: the species of this genus have also been classified in the genera Cydonia and Pyrus. Pseudocydonia sinensis Schneid. has the synonyms Chaenomeles sinensis and Cydonia sinensis (Dum.-Cours.) Schneid.

Chamaecyparis Spach: synonymies with Cupressus, Retinispora, Thuyopsis.

Chamaecyparis obtusa (Sieb. et Zucc.) Sieb. et Zucc. ex Endl.: syn.: Retinispora obtusa Sieb. et Zucc., Cupressus obtusa (Sieb. et Zucc.) K. Koch. The botanical variety ericoides also has the synonym Retinispora sanderi.

Cheiranthus cheiri L.: syn.: Erysimum cheiri (L.) Crantz. The botanical variety senonieri also has the synonym C. senonieri.

Chimonanthus Lindl.: synonymies with Calycanthus.

Chrysanthemum L.: synonymies with Anthemis, Balsamita, Chrysoboltonia, Leucanthemum, Matricaria, Parthenium, Plagius, Pyrethrum, Tanacetum.

Chrysanthemum cinerariaefolium Bocq.: syn.: C. cinerariifolium (Trev.) Vis. (name stabilized by ISTA), Pyrethrum cinerariifolium Trev., Tanacetum cinerariifolium (Trev.) Schultz Bip.

Chrysanthemum coccineum Willd.: syn.: C. roseum Adam, Pyrethrum roseum (Adam) M.B., P. carneum M.B.

Chrysanthemum coronarium L.: syn.: C. segetum Hemsl.

Chrysanthemum maximum Ram.: syn.: Leucanthemum maximum (Ram.) DC. C. maximum hort. is a synonym of C. lacustre Brot. (C. superbum Bergm.).

Chrysanthemum morifolium Ramat.: syn.: C. sinense Sabine, C. vestitum Stapf, Dendranthema morifolium (Ramat.) Tzvelev.

Cimicifuga Wernischek: synonymies with Actaea, Pytirosperma.

Cinnamomum camphora (L.) Sieb. var. glaucescens Kamikoti: Synonyms for the species: C. camphora Th. Nees et Eberm., Camphora officinarum, Laurus camphora L.

Cirsium Mill. emend. Scop.: synonymies with Carduus, Cnicus, Ptilostemon.

Cistus L.: synonymies with Fumana, Halimium.

Citrullus lanatus (Thunb.) Matsum. et Nakai: syn.: Cucurbita citrullus L., Momordica lanata Thunb., Citrullus vulgaris Schrad., Cucumis citrullus.

Citrus L.: synonymies with Aurantium, Fortunella, Limonia, Poncirus.

Citrus limon (L.) Burm. f.: syn.: C. limonum Risso, C. medica var. limon L., C. medica var. limonum (Risso) Wight et Arn.

Citrus paradisi Macf.: syn.: C. decumana var. racemosa (Risso et Poit.) Roem., C. racemosa (Risso et Poit.) Marcov. ex Tanaka.

Citrus reticulata Blanco: syn.: C. nobilis Andr. non Lour., C. deliciosa Ten.

Citrus sinensis (L.) Osbeck: syn.: C. aurantium Lour., C. aurantium var. sinensis L., C. aurantium ssp. sinensis (L.) Engl.

Clematis L.: synonymies with Atragene, Clematopsis.

Clematis heracleifolia DC.: syn.: C. tubulosa Turcz. C. davidiana Decne. ex Verlot is a synonym of C. heracleifolia DC. var. davidiana (Decne. ex Verlot) Hemsl.

Cleome L.: synonymies with Gynandropsis, Peritoma.

Clethra alnifolia L.: the botanical varieties have also been made into species (C. paniculata, C. tomentosa).

Clethra barbinervis Sieb. et Zucc.: syn.: C. canescens.

Clethra tomentosa Lam.: syn.: C. alnifolia pubescens, C. alnifolia tomentosa.

Clivia Lindl.: synonymies with Imantophyllum.

Codiaeum variegatum (L.) A. Juss.: syn.: Croton variegatus L. C. pictum (Lodd.) Hook. is a synonym of C. variegatum (L.) A. Juss. var. pictum (Lodd.) Muell. Arg.

Colchicum L.: synonymies with Bulbicum, Merendera.

Coleus Lour.: synonymies with Germanea, Neomuellera, Plectranthus.

Colocasia Schott: synonymies with Alocasia, Arum, Caladium.

Convallaria L.: certain species of the genera Liriope, Maianthemum, Ophiopogon and Polygonatum have also been classified in the genus Convallaria. C. fruticosa Stickm. is a synonym of Cordyline fruticosa (Stickm.) Chev.

Cordyline Comm.: synonymies with Dracaena. C. fruticosa (Stickm.) Chev. has the synonym Convallaria Stickm.

Coreopsis L.: synonymies with Bidens, Calliopsis, Chrysostemma, Cosmos, Leptosyne.

Cornus alba L.: syn.: C. tatarica Mill. C. sibirica is a synonym of C. alba L. var. sibirica. C. alba Wangenh. non L. is a synonym of C. stolonifera Michx.

Cornus controversa Hemsl.: syn.: C. brachipoda K. Koch non C.A. Mey.

Cornus florida L.: syn.: Cynoxylon floridum.

Cornus kousa (Buerger ex Miq.) Hance: syn.: Dendrobenthamia japonica.

Cornus mas L.: syn.: Macrocarpium mas.

Cornus nuttallii Audub.: syn.: Cynoxylon nuttallii.

Cortaderia Stapf: synonymies with Arundo, Gynerium.

Cosmos Cav.: synonymies with Bidens, Coreopsis, Dahlia.

Cotoneaster (B. Ehrh.) Medik.: synonymies with Mespilus (C. acuminata and M. acuminata), Pyracantha (C. pyracantha and P. coccinea).

Crataegus L.: synonymies with Malus and Pyrus (C. trilobata), Mespilus (C. orientalis and M. odoratissima), Sorbus.

Cryptanthus Otto et A. Dietr.: synonymies with Billbergia, Catopsis, Tillandsia.

Cryptomeria japonica Hassk.: the botanical varieties of this species, the only one of its genus, have also been made into species in their own right.

Cryptotaenia japonica Hassk.: Syn.: C. canadensis Sieb. et Zucc.

Cucumis L.: synonymies with Citrullus, Cucurbita, Luffa.

Cucurbita L.: synonymies with Benincasa, Citrullus, Cucumis (Cucurbita foetidissima and Cucumis perennis - ornamental species), Lagenaria, Sicana.

Cucurbita maxima Duch.: C. maxima Wight et Arn. is a synonym of C. moschata Duch.

Cucurbita pepo L.: syn.: C. melopepo L., C. ovifera L., C. verrucosa L. C. pepo Lour. is a synonym of Benincasa hispida (Thunb.) Cogn.

Cyclamen persicum Mill.: syn.: C. latifolium Sibth. et Sm., C. aleppicum Fisch., C. puniceum Pomel, C. aleppicum ssp. puniceum (Pomel) Glasau, C. tomentosum, C. albidum.

Cymbidium Sw.: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with Cymbidiella, Cyperorchis, Epidendrum, Grammangis, Grammatophyllum, Iridorchis.

Cyrtanthus L. f.: C. clavatus has also been named Gastronema clavatum.

Cytisus L.: synonymies with Cajanus, Chamaecytisus, Corothamnus, Genista, Laburnum, Lembotropis, Petteria, Sarothamnus, Spartium, Spartocytisus, Teline.

Cytisus fragrans Lam.: syn.: C. supranubius, C. nubigenus, Genista fragrans, G. nubigenus, Spartocytisus supranubius.

Daboecia D. Don: synonymies with Boretta, Menziesia.

Dahlia Cav.: D. zimapanii is a synonym of Cosmos diversifolius.

Daphne L.: synonymies with Funifera, Mezereon, Thymelaea.

Daphne odora Thunb.: syn.: D. japonica Paxt., D. sinensis, D. indica hort.

Daucus carota L. ssp. sativus (Hoffm.) Arcang.: syn.: D. sativus (Hoffm.) Röhl.

Delphinium L.: synonymies with Consolida.

Dendrobium Sw.: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with Aporum, Callista, Dipodium, Epigeneium, Genyorchis, Latouria.

Dianthus L.: D. noeanus is frequently commercialized under the name Acanthophyllum spinosum.

Dicentra Borkh. emend. Bernh.: synonymies with Diclythra, Diclytra, Dielytra, Fumaria.

Dieffenbachia Schott: synonymies with Caladium.

Diervilla Mill.: modern American authors group under the name Diervilla solely the species of American origin and under the name Weigela the Asiatic species (A. Belot. Dictionnaire des arbres et arbustes de jardin - Bordas). Others group all species under the name Diervilla.

Digitalis L.: D. chinensis is a synonym of Adenosma grandiflorum.

Dioscorea L.: synonymies with Bordera, Helmia, Oncos, Tamus, Testudinaria.

X Doritaenopsis hort.: see under Orchidaceae. Hybrids Doritis X Phalaenopsis. Syn.: X Doritopsis hort.

Doronicum L.: synonymies with Arnica, Aronicum.

Dracaena Vand. ex L.: syn.: Terminalis. Synonymies with Cordyline and subsidiarily Sansevieria.

Emilia Cass.: synonymies with Cacalia, Senecio.

Enkianthus Lour.: synonymies with Andromeda, Meisteria, Melidora, Rhodora.

Epidendrum L. 1763, non 1753: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with Barkezia, Broughtonia, Cattleya, Caularthon, Diacrium, Dinema, Encyclia, Isochilus, Nanodes, Schomburgkia, Seraphyta, Sobralia.

Epiphyllopsis Berger, Rhipsalidopsis Britt. et Rose, Schlumbergera Lem., Zygocactus K. Schum.: the majority of the species of these genera have been classified in the genus Epiphyllum and are still known under that name, which is the correct one for the plants formerly known as Phyllocactus. The genus Epiphyllopsis is not mentioned in the Dictionary of Gardening. Zander refers to Rhipsalidopsis gaertneri (Regel) Lindgr. (Epiphyllum russellianum Hook. var. gaertneri Regel, Schlumbergera gaertneri (Regel) Britt. et Rose, Epiphyllopsis gaertneri (Regel) Berger). The genus Rhipsalidopsis is monotypic according to the Dictionary of Gardening, the species being R. rosea (Lagerh.) Britt. et Rose and having as synonym Rhipsalis rosea Lagerh. According to Zander, this genus also comprises R. gaertneri (Regel) Lindgr. (see above) and R. X graeseri (Werderm.) Moran (R. gaertneri X R. rosea, Rhipsalis X graeseri Werderm., X Ripsaphyllum graeseri Werderm.). The genus Schlumbergera comprises according to the Dictionary of Gardening S. gaertneri (see above) and S. russelliana (Gardn.) Britt. et Rose (Epiphyllum russellianum Hook.) and according to Zander the latter only. Finally the genus Zygocactus is monotypic according to the Dictionary of Gardening, the species being Z. truncatus (Haw.) K. Schum. and having as synonyms Epiphyllum truncatum Haw. and--according to Zander--Schlumbergera truncata (Haw.) Moran. In addition Zander has on the one hand separated the cultivated varieties under the name Z.-Hybridii and on the other hand distinguished the following two botanical varieties within the species Z. truncatus:

- var. altensteinii (Pfeiff.) Lem. (Z. altensteinii (Pfeiff.) K. Schum., Epiphyllum altensteinii Pfeiff., Schlumbergera truncata var. altensteinii (Pfeiff.) Moran)

- var. truncatus.

In the twelfth edition of Zander (1980), Zygocactus has been included in Schlumbergera, the latter having been enriched by two further species: S. opuntioides and S. orssichiana. The botanical varieties of Z. truncatus are no longer mentioned therein.

Eragrostis curvula (Schrad.) Nees: syn.: Poa curvula Schrad.

Erica carnea L.: syn.: E. herbacea L. The latter name is frequently used for E. carnea var. alba.

Erica ciliaris L.: the variety maweana is also known as E. maweana.

Erica X darleyensis Bean = E. carnea X E. mediterranea. Syn.: E. hybrida, E. mediterranea hybrida.

Erica lusitanica Rud.: syn.: E. coconodes.

Erica mackaiana Bab.: this is probably a hybrid E. ciliaris X E. tetralix.

Erica mediterranea hort.: syn.: E. purpurascens L. The Dictionary of Gardening gives also E. carnea occidentalis as a synonym of E. mediterranea.

Erica terminalis Salisb.: syn.: E. stricta Andr. non Donn ex Willd., E. corsica, E. ramulosa.

Erica X veitchii Bean = E. arborea X E. lusitanica.

Erica X watsonii Benth. = E. ciliaris X E. tetralix.

Erica X williamsii Druce = E. tetralix X E. vagans.

Erigeron L.: synonymies with Aster, Stenactis, Vittadinia.

Eriobotrya japonica (Thunb.) Lindl.: syn.: Mespilus japonica, Photinia japonica.

Eucryphia glutinosa (Poepp. et Endl.) Baill.: syn.: E. pinnatifolia Gay.

Eucryphia X intermedia Bausch: name proposed for hybrids between E. glutinosa and E. lucida.

Eucryphia X nymanensis Bausch: name proposed for hybrids between E. cordifolia and E. glutinosa.

Euphorbia L.: synonymies with Monadenium, Pedilanthus, Poinsettia, Sarcostemma.

Euphorbia fulgens Karw.: syn.: E. jacquiniiflora Hook.

Euphorbia-Milii-Hybridi: E. milii Desmoulins has the synonym E. splendens Boj. ex Hook. Its botanical variety milii is also known as E. bojeri Hook. E. hislopiae N.E. Br. has the synonym E. milii var. hislopiae (N.E. Br.) Ursch et Leandri.

Euphorbia pulcherrima Willd. ex Klotzsch: syn.: Poinsettia pulcherrima (Willd. ex Klotzsch) Grah.

Eustoma russellianum (Hook.) G. Don: syn.: Lisianthus russelianus Hook.

Exochorda Lindl.: E. racemosa has also been named Spiraea grandiflora.

Fagopyrum esculentum Moench.: syn.: Polygonum fagopyrum L., F. sagittatum Gilib., F. vulgare Th. Nees.

Fagus L.: synonymies with Castanea, Nothofagus.

X Fatshedera Guillaum. = Fatsia X Hedera.

Festuca L.: F. fluitans L. is a synonym of Glyceria fluitans (L.) R. Br. and F. spicata Pursh. a synonym of Agropyrum spicatum (Pursh.) Scribn. et Smith.

Festuca arundinacea Schreb.: syn.: F. elatior L. p.p.

Festuca ovina L. sensu lato: according to ISTA, this species includes F. tenuifolia Sibth.

Festuca pratensis Huds.: syn.: F. elatior L. (according to ISTA and the Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas), F. elatior L. p.p. (according to Zander).

Festuca rubra L.: syn.: F. heterophylla Lam.

Foeniculum vulgare P. Mill.: syn.: F. foeniculum Karst., F. officinale All. The botanical variety dulce Batt. et Trab. has the synonym F. dulce Mill.

Fortunella Swingle: synonymies with Citrus, Sclerostylis.

Fuchsia magellanica Lam.: syn.: F. macrostemma Ruiz et Pav. The botanical variety 'Riccartonii' has the synonyms F. riccartonii Lebas, F. riccartoniana hort.

Gaillardia Foug.: G. acaulis Pursh is a synonym of Hymenoxys (Pursh) Parker (Actinea acaulis (Pursh) Spreng., Tetraneurus acaulis (Pursh) Greene, Actinea herbacea A. Gray).

Galega L.: G. singapou Buchoz. is a synonym of Tephrosia singapou (Buchoz.) A. Cheval.

Gardenia Ellis: synonymies with Mitriostigma, Randia.

Garrya X thuretii Carr. = G. elliptica X G. pernettya.

X Gaulnettya W.J. Marchant = Gaultheria X Pernettya.

Gaultheria Kalm ex L.: synonymies with Andromeda, Arbutus, Brossaea, Diplycosia, Pernettya, Pieris, Vaccinium.

Genista L.: synonymies with Chamaespartium, Cytisanthus, Cytisus, Echinospartum, Genistella, Pterospartium, Retama, Scorpius, Spartium.

Gentiana L.: synonymies with Crawfurdia, Gentianella, Golownina.

Geranium L.: synonymies with Erodium, Pelargonium.

Geum L.: synonymies with Parageum, Sieversia.

Gladiolus L.: synonymies with Homoglossum, Lapeirousia.

Glycine max (L.) Merrill: syn.: Dolichos soja L., Phaseolus max L., Soja hispida Moench, G. hispida (Moench) Maxim.

Godetia Spach: synonymies with Oenothera.

Gossypium hirsutum L.: the botanical variety punctatum has the synonyms G. religiosum L., G. punctatum Schumach.

Grifola frondosa (Fr.) S.F. Gray: syn.: Griphola frondosa, Polyporus frondosus.

Guzmania Ruiz et Pav.: synonymies with Caraguata, Massangea, Pitcairnia, Puya, Schlumbergia, Vriesea.

Gypsophila L.: synonymies with Banffya, Phrynia.

Halesia J. Ellis ex L.: H. corymbosa is a synonym of Pterostyrax corymbosa.

Hebe Comm. ex Juss.: syn.: Veronica L. sect. Hebe.

Hedera L.: synonymies with Acanthopanax, Kissodendron.

Helianthemum Mill.: synonymies with Fumana, Halimium.

Helianthus L.: synonymies with Harpalium, Rudbeckia.

Helianthus annuus L.: syn.: H. lenticularis Doug.

Helichrysum Mill. corr. Pers.: synonymies with Aphelexis, Gnaphalium, Leucogenes, Ozothamnus, Xeranthemum.

Helleborus niger L.: the sub-species macranthus (Freyn) Schiffn. (vernalis, angustifolius, maximus) has also been made into a species under the name H. macranthus Freyn.

Hemerocallis L.: synonymies with Hosta.

Heuchera L.: synonymies with Heucherella (= Heuchera X Tiarella), Tiarella.

Hibiscus L.: synonymies with Abelmoschus, Althaea, Thespesia.

Hibiscus cannabinus L.: syn.: H. aspera Hook. f.

Hibiscus syriacus L.: syn.: Althaea fruticosa.

Hippeastrum Herb.: synonymies with Amaryllis, Griffinia, Habranthus, Phycelia, Sprekelia, Zephyranthes.

Holcus L.: *H. odoratus* L. is a synonym of *Hierochloë odorata* (L.) P. Beauv. The species of the genus *Sorghum* have also been classified in the genus *Holcus*.

Hordeum vulgare L. sensu lato: *H. sativum* Jess. is a synonym of *H. vulgare* L. The subdivisions of this species have also been made into species.

Hordeum vulgare L. convar. distichon (L.) Alef.: syn.: *H. distichon* L., *H. zeocriton* L.

Hordeum vulgare L. convar. vulgare: syn.: *H. hexastichon* L., *H. polystichon* Haller, *H. polystichum* Doell, *H. tetrastichum* Stokes.

Hosta Tratt.: syn.: *Funckia* Dumort. non Willd., *Funkia* Spreng. In addition, synonymies with *Hemerocallis*.

Hypericum L.: synonymies with *Androsaemum*, *Helodes*, *Webbia*.

Iberis L.: *I. cappadocica* is a synonym of *Ptilotrichum cappadocicum*.

Ilex L.: *I. verticillata* (L.) Gray has the synonym *Prinos verticillatus* L.

Ilex X altaclarensis (Loud.) Dallim. = *I. aquifolium* X *I. perado*.

Impatiens L.: synonymies with *Balsamina*.

Indigofera gerardiana (Wall.) Bak.: syn.: *I. dosua* Lindl. non D. Don.

Indigofera incarnata (Willd.) Nakai: syn.: *I. decora* Lindl.

Ipomoea batatas (L.) Poir.: syn.: *Batatas edulis*, *Convolvulus batatas* L., *I. mammosa* Choisy.

Ipomoea tricolor Cav.: syn.: *I. violacea* L., *I. rubro-coerulea* Hook., *Pharbitis rubro-coerulea* (Hook.) Choisy, *P. tricolor*.

Iris L.: synonymies with *Dientes*, *Gynandriris*, *Hermodactylus*, *Moraea*, *Pardan-thus*, *Xiphion*.

Ixia L. 1762, non 1753: synonymies with *Belamcanda*, *Lapeirousia*, *Morphixia*, *Sparaxis*, *Tritonia*, *Wurmea*.

Jasminum grandiflorum L.: syn.: *J. officinale* L. (according to the *Diccionario de Plantas Agrícolas*), *J. officinale* f. *grandiflorum* (L.) Kobuski (according to Zander). *J. grandiflorum* hort. is a synonym of *J. officinale* L. f. *affine* Royle ex Lindl. according to Zander.

Jasminum humile L.: the botanical variety *revolutum* has also been made into a species under the names *J. revolutum* Sims, *J. reevesii*, *J. triumphans*. *J. wallichianum* Lindl. has the synonyms *J. humile* L. f. *wallichianum* (Lindl.) P.S. Green, *J. humile* L. var. *glabrum* (DC.) Kobuski, *J. pubigerum* D. Don var. *glabrum* DC.

Jasminum officinale L.: the form *affine* has the synonyms *J. affine* Royle ex Lindl., *J. grandiflorum* hort. non L. *J. grandiflorum* L. has also been considered a form of *J. officinale*.

Jasminum X stephanense Lemoine = *J. beesianum* X *J. officinale*.

Juglans L.: synonymies with *Carya*.

Juniperus L.: *J. drupacea* Labill. has the synonym *Arceuthos drupacea* (Labill.) Ant. et Kotschy. *J. ericooides* has the synonym *Callitris calcarata*.

Kalanchoë Adans: synonymies with *Bryophyllum*, *Cotyledon*, *Kitchingia*.

Kalmia L.: *K. hirsuta* has the synonym *Kalmiella hirsuta*.

Kerria japonica (L.) DC.: syn.: K. lutea, Corchorus japonica.

Kniphofia Moench: synonymies with Tritonia.

Laburnum Fabr.: synonymies with Cytisus.

Lachenalia Jacq. ex Murr.: synonymies with Phormium, Scilla.

Lactuca sativa L.: The botanical varieties have also been made into species (L. angustana Host, L. capitata Gars., L. intybacea Jacq., L. romana Gars. and L. sativa DC.).

Laelia Lindl.: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with Bletia, Brassavola, Cattleya, Neocogniauxia, Schomburkia.

X Laeliocattleya Rolfe: see under Orchidaceae. Hybrids Cattleya X Laelia.  
Synonyme: X Catlaelia hort.

Lagenaria siceraria (Mol.) Standl. var. hispida Hara.: syn.: Benincasa hispida (Thunb.) Cogn., B. cerifera Savi, Cucurbita hispida Thunb. The species L. siceraria (Mol.) Standl. also has the synonyms Cucurbita lagenaria L., C. siceraria Mol., L. leucantha Rusby, L. vulgaris Ser.

Lantana Mill.: L. selloviana has the synonym Lippia montevidensis.

Larix kaempferi (Lamb.) Carr.: syn.: L. leptolepis (Sieb. et Zucc.) Sieb. ex Gord. - according to Zander and ISTA - and Pseudolarix amabilis - according to the Dictionary of Gardening. According to the latter, it is the L. kaempferi of Sargent which is synonymous with L. leptolepis and with L. japonica.

Ligularia Cass.: synonymies with Erythrochaete, Farfugium, Senecio, Tussilago.

Lilium L.: synonymies with Cardiocrinum, Fritillaria, Nomocharis, Notholirion.

Limonium Mill.: syn.: Statice L. p.p., the other part being Armeria.

Linaria Mill.: the genus Linaria is frequently divided into three genera, namely: Cymbalaria, Chaenorhinum, Linaria (in the restricted sense).

Linum usitatissimum L.: syn.: L. crepitans (Boenningh.) Dumort., L. humile Mill., L. humile Planch.

Litchi chinensis Sonn.: syn.: Nephelium litchi, Scyrtalia chinensis.

Lithospermum L.: synonymies with Buglossoides, Lithodora, Moltkia.

Lobelia L.: synonymies with Haynalda, Isotoma, Monopsis, Pratia, Siphocampylus, Tupa.

Lolium X boucheanum Kunth. = L. multiflorum X L. perenne.

Lolium multiflorum Lam.: syn.: L. italicum A. Braun, L. multiflorum DC.

Lotus spp.: synonymies with *Carmichaelia*, *Tetragonolobus*.

Lotus uliginosus Schkuhr: syn.: *L. pedunculatus* auct. non Cav.

Luffa cylindrica M.J. Roem.: according to Zander, this species is not identical to *L. aegyptiaca* Mill. (*Momordica luffa* L., *M. cylindrica* L.). The Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas and the Dictionary of Gardening consider them to be synonyms.

Lupinus albus L.: syn.: *L. hirsutus* Eichw. non L. nec *Forsk.*, *L. sativus* Gaertn., *L. varius* Gaertn. non L. nec *Savi* and, according to Zander, *L. termis* *Forsk.* The Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas considers the latter as a distinct species.

Lupinus angustifolius L.: syn.: *L. varius* *Savi* non L.

Lycaste Lindl.: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with *Bifrenaria*, *Colax*, *Maxillaria*, *Paphinia*.

Lychnis L.: synonymies with *Agrostemma*, *Coronaria*, *Melandrium*, *Petrocoptis*, *Silene*, *Viscaria*.

Lychnis coronaria (L.) Desr.: syn.: *L. tomentosa*, *Coronaria tomentosa* A. Br., *C. coriacea* Schischkin ex Gorschk., *Agrostemma coronaria*.

Lycopersicon lycopersicum (L.) Karst. ex Farwell: other synonym: *L. esculentum* Dunal.

Lycoris Herb.: synonymies with *Amaryllis*, *Nerine*, *Ungernia*.

Magnolia L.: synonymies with *Michelia*, *Talauma*.

Mahonia Nutt.: see under *Berberis*.

Mahonia aquifolium (Pursh) Nutt.: syn.: *Berberis aquifolium* Pursh. *M. pinnata* (Lag.) Fedde (*M. fascicularis* DC.) is considered to be a distinct species by the Dictionary of Gardening and Zander, and to be *M. aquifolium* 'Fascicularis' in the Dictionnaire des arbres et arbustes de jardin (A. Belot - Bordas).

Mahonia bealei (Fort.) Carr.: syn.: *Berberis japonica* var. *bealei* (Fort.) Skeels, *B. bealei* Fort. The Dictionary of Gardening and Zander make *M. japonica* (Thunb.) DC. (*B. japonica* (Thunb.) R. Br.) into a distinct species, the first adding that *M. japonica* is distributed under the incorrect name *M. bealei* and vice versa. The Dictionnaire des arbres et arbustes de jardin considers *M. bealii* to be *M. japonica* var. *bealei*.

Mahonia japonica (Thunb.) DC.: see under *Mahonia bealei* (Fort.) Carr.

Mahonia repens (Lindl.) G. Don: syn.: *Berberis repens* Lindl.

Malus Mill.: syn.: *Pyrus* L. partim. Synonymies with *Crataegus*, *Eriolobus*.

Malus domestica Borkh.: syn.: *M. sylvestris* Mill. var. *domestica* (Borkh.) Mansf., *M. pumila* var. *domestica* (Borkh.) Schneid. Most varieties cultivated in Europe belong to this species. *M. sylvestris* Mill. has the synonyms *Pyrus malus* L., *P. sylvestris* S.F. Gray non Moench, *M. communis* Poir.

Malva L.: synonymies with *Callirhoë*, *Lavatera*, *Malvastrum*, *Sphaeralcea*.

Maranta L.: synonymies with *Alpinia*, *Calathea*, *Ctenanthe*, *Saranthe*, *Stromanthe*.

Matthiola incana (L.) R. Br.: syn.: *M. annua*.

Medicago falcata L.: see under *Medicago sativa* L.

Medicago hispida Gaertn.: syn.: *M. denticulata* Boiss.

Medicago lupulina L.: syn.: *M. lupulina* Scop.

Medicago sativa L.: according to Zander, this species comprises the following sub-species:

- ssp. *caerulea* (Less. ex Ledeb.) Schmalh. (*M. caerulea* Less. ex Ledeb.)
- ssp. *falcata* (L.) Arcang. (*M. falcata* L.)
- ssp. *falcata* X ssp. *sativa* (*M. X varia* Martyn)
- ssp. *sativa*.

Medicago X varia Martyn: see under *Medicago sativa L.*

Mentha L.: *M. requienii* Benth. has the synonyms *Menthella requienii* (Benth.) Pér., *Menthella conica*. Synonymies with *Pogostemon* (*M. cablin* Blanco and *P. cablin* (Blanco) Benth. and *M. perilloides* L. and *P. perilloides* (L.) Mansf.).

Miltonia Lindl.: see under *Orchidaceae*. Synonymies with *Macrochilus*, *Odontoglossum*, *Oncidium*.

Mimetes spec.: see under *Orothamnus spec.*

Momordica charantia L.: syn.: *M. muricata* Willd. (according to Zander) and *M. balsamina* Blanco, *M. balsamina* Descourt. (according to the *Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas*). According to the Dictionary of Gardening, the botanical varieties have also been made into species (*M. chinensis* and *M. muricata*) and *M. marteniensis* may also belong to the species in question. *M. charantia* Descourt. is a synonym of *M. balsamina* L.

Monstera Adans.: synonymies with *Macgravia*, *Philodendron*, *Raphiodophora*. The species most commonly known as *Philodendron* is *Monstera deliciosa* Liebm. (*Philodendron pertusum* Kunth et Bouché).

Morus L.: *M. papyrifera* L. is a synonym of *Broussonetia papyrifera* (L.) L'Hér. and *M. tinctoria* L. of *Chlorophora tinctoria* (L.) Gaud.

Musa cavendishii Lamb.: syn.: *M. acuminata* Colla, *M. malaccensis* Ridl., *M. sinensis*, *M. X paradisiaca* L., *M. X sapientium* L.

Narcissus L.: synonymies with *Corbularia*, *Hermione*.

Nelumbo nucifera Gaertn.: syn.: *Nelumbium nelumbo* (L.) Druce, *N. speciosum* Willd.

Neoregelia L.B. Sm.: synonymies with *Aregelia* and *Nidularium*, names under which the species of this genus are described in the Dictionary of Gardening, which also records synonymies with *Bromelia* and *Karatas*.

Nepeta L.: synonymies with *Dracocephalum*, *Glechoma*, *Hyptis*, *Micromeria*, *Thymus*.

Nephrolepis Schott: *N. acutifolia* has the synonyms *Isoloma lanuginosum*, *Lindsaya lanuginosa*.

Nerine Herb.: synonymies with *Amaryllis*, *Lycoris*.

Nopalxochia Britt. et Rose: synonymies with *Epiphyllum*, *Phyllocactus*.

Nothofagus Bl.: synonymies with *Fagus*.

Nymphaea L.: synonymies with *Nuphar*.

Odontoglossum H.B.K.: see under *Orchidaceae*. This genus includes *Mesospindium*. Synonymies with *Cochlioda*, *Miltonia*, *Oncidium*, *Zygopetalum*.

Oenanthe javanica (Bl.) DC.: syn.: *O. stolonifera* Wall.

Oenothera L.: the sub-genera have also been made into genera (*Anogra*, *Calylophis*, *Chyliismia*, *Hartmannia*, *Kneiffia*, *Lavauxia*, *Megapterium*, *Pachylophus*, *Raimannia*, *Sphaerostigma*, *Taraxia*). Other synonymies with *Godetia*, *Meriolix*, *Onagra*, *Xylopleurum*.

Olea europaea L.: the fruiting sub-species europaea has also been made into a species under the name O. sativa Hoffmigg. et Link.

Olearia X haastii Hook. f. = O. avicenniifolia X O. moschata.

Oncidium Sw.: see under Orchidaceae. This genus includes Cyrtochilum and Palumbina. Synonymies with Cymbidium, Epidendrum, Leochilus, Lophiaris, Miltonia, Odontoglossum, Waluewa.

Onobrychis viciifolia Scop.: syn.: Hedysarum onobrychis L., O. sativa Lam.

Orchidaceae Juss.: This very large family is characterized by many synonymies and by easy interspecific and intergeneric hybridizations. This family is specified as protected in several States, whereas others protect certain of its genera. The genera mentioned in the main table are the following: Aërides, Angraecum, Ascocentrum, Bletilla, Brassavola, Calanthe, Cattleya, Cymbidium, Dendrobium, X Doritaenopsis, Epidendrum, Laelia, X Laeliocattleya, Lycaste, Miltonia, Odontoglossum, Oncidium, Paphiopedilum, Phalaenopsis, Renanthera, Rhynchostylis, Sophronitis, Vanda, X Vuylstekeara.

Origanum L.: synonymies with Amaracus, Majorana.

Ornithogalum spec.: O. vittatum has also been described as Albuca vittata.

Ornithopus sativus Brot.: syn.: O. sativus Link. O. sativus Willk. is a synonym of O. isthmocarpus Coss.

Orothamnus spec.: monotypic genus, the species of which (O. zeyheri) has the synonym Mimetes zeyheri.

Osmanthus Lour.: synonymies with Olea, Siphonosmanthus.

Osmanthus heterophyllus (G. Don) P.S. Green: synonym other than those indicated in the main table: Olea aquifolium Sieb. et Zucc.

Oxalis L.: O. sensitiva is a synonym of Biophytum sensitivum.

Paeonia albiflora Pall.: syn.: P. lactiflora Pall., P. chinensis hort., P. sinensis (Sims) hort., P. edulis sinensis.

Paeonia officinalis L.: according to Zander, this species includes the sub-species humilis (Retz.) Cull. et Heyw., which has the synonyms P. humilis Retz., P. peregrina var. humilis (Retz.) Huth. In the Dictionary of Gardening, P. banatica, P. clusii, P. coriacea, P. peregrina are classified as species and it is stated that they are also considered subdivisions of P. officinalis.

Paeonia suffruticosa Andr.: syn.: P. arborea Donn, P. moutan Sims.

Panax ginseng C.A. Mey.: syn.: P. schingseng Nees.

Panicum L.: synonymies with Beckmannia, Brachiara, Cynodon, Digitaria, Echinochloa, Oplismenus, Pennisetum, Setaria, Sorghum, Trichachne, Tricholaena.

Paphiopedilum Pfitz.: see under Orchidaceae. Syn.: Cypripedium hort. non L.

Paranomus spec.: synonymies with Nivenia, Protea.

Parrotia C.A. Mey.: P. jacquemontiana Decne. has the synonym Parrotiopsis jacquemontiana (Decne.) Rehd.

Parthenocissus Planch.: synonymies with Ampelopsis, Cissus, Vitis.

Passiflora edulis Sims: syn.: P. laurifolia F. Vill.

Pastinaca sativa L.: syn.: Peucedanum sativum.

Pelargonium L'Hér. ex Ait.: synonymies with Geranium.

Pelargonium-Peltatum-Hybrid: syn.: P. peltatum hort. non (L.) L'Hér. ex Ait.

Pelargonium-Zonale-Hybridi: syn.: *P. X hortorum* L.H. Bailey, *P. zonale* hort. non (L.) L'Hér. ex Ait.

Pennisetum typhoides (Burm.) Stapf et C.E. Hubb.: syn.: *P. glaucum* (L.) R. Br., *Setaria glauca* (L.) P. Beauv., *P. typhoideum* L.C. Rich., *P. americanum* (L.) K. Schum. ssp. *typhoideum* (L.C. Rich.) Maire et Zeiller. The Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas cites *P. typhoides* (Burm. f.) L.C. Rich. with the synonyms *Alopecurus typhoides* Burm. f., *Panicum glaucum* L., *Penicillaria spicata* Beauv., *Pennisetum spicatum* Roem. et Schult., *Pennisetum typhoideum* L.

Penstemon Schmidel: synonymies with *Chelone*.

Perilla L.: *P. frutescens* (L.) Britt. has the synonyms *Ocymum frutescens* L., *P. ocymoides* L., *P. arguta* Benth. The subdivision 'Nankinensis' has the synonyms var. *crispa* (Thunb.) Decne. ex L.H. Bailey, *Ocymum crispum* Thunb., *P. nankinensis* (Lour.) Decne.

Pernettya Gaudich.: synonymies with *Arbutus*, *Gaultheria*.

Persea americana P. Mill.: syn.: *P. gratissima* Gaertn. f.

Petasites japonicus (Sieb. et Zucc.) Fr. Schmidt: syn.: *Nardosmia japonica*.

Petroselinum crispum (Mill.) Nym. ex A.W. Hill: syn.: *Apium crispum* Mill., *A. petroselinum* L., *P. hortense* auct. non Hoffm., *P. sativum* Hoffm., *Carum petroselinum*.

Petroselinum crispum (Mill.) Nym. ex A.W. Hill ssp. *tuberosum* (Bernh. ex Rchb.) Soo.: syn.: *P. crispum* (Mill.) Nym. ex A.W. Hill convar. *radicosum* (Alef.) Danert, *Apium latifolium* Mill., *P. sativum* var. *latifolium* Alef.

Phalaenopsis Bl.: see under *Orchidaceae*. Synonymies with *Doritis*, *Kingiella*, *Polychilus*, *Sarcocilus*, *Strauopsis*, *Trichoglottis*.

Phalaris spp.: synonymies with *Beckmannia*, *Vetiveria*

Phalaris arundinacea L.: syn.: *Typhoides arundinacea* (L.) Moench, *Baldingera arundinacea* (L.) Dumort., *Digraphis arundinacea*.

Pharbitis nil Chois.: according to Zander, this species has the synonyms *Ipomoea nil* (L.) Roth, *Convolvulus nil* L. and includes *Ipomoea imperialis* hort. (japanische Kaiserwinde). According to the Dictionary of Gardening, Japanese Morning Glory is species *P. X imperialis*, probably a cross between *P. hederacea* and *P. tricolor*. *P. hederacea* has the synonyms *Convolvulus nil*, *P. albomarginata*, *Ipomoea limbata*. Concerning *P. tricolor*, see under *Ipomoea tricolor*.

Phaseolus angularis (Willd.) W.F. Wight: syn.: *Vigna angularis* (Willd.) Ohwi et Olashi, *Dolichos angularis* Willd.

Phaseolus coccineus L.: syn.: *P. multiflorus* Lam., *P. multiflorus* Willd.

Philodendron Schott corr. Schott: synonymies with *Anthurium*, *Caladium*, *Monslera*. In particular, *Monstera deliciosa* Liebm. has the synonym *P. pertusum* Kunth et Bouché and is known by the name *Philodendron*.

Phormium J.R. et G. Forst.: synonymies with *Lachenalia*.

Photinia Lindl.: synonymies with *Crataegus*, *Eriobotrya*, *Heteromeles*. *Eriobotrya japonica* (Thunb.) Lindl. has notably the synonym *P. japonica*.

Physostegia virginiana (L.) Benth.: syn.: *Dracocephalum variegatum*, *D. virginianum*.

Picea A. Dietr.: the nomenclature is very complex as there have been confusions with *Abies*, *Pinus* and *Tsuga*. In addition, certain botanists have identified 40 species, others having reduced some of them to synonyms.

Picea glehnii (Fr. Schmidt) Mast.: syn.: *Abies glehnii*.

Picea jezoensis (Sieb. et Zucc.) Carr.: syn.: *P. ajanensis* Fisch. ex Carr.; the botanical variety *hondoensis* (Mayr) Rehd. is also named *P. hondoensis* Mayr.

Pieris D. Don: synonymies with Andromeda, Arcterica, Lyonia, Portuna.

Pieris japonica (Thunb.) D. Don ex G. Don: syn.: Andromeda japonica Thunb.

Pinus L.: synonymies with Abies, Picea.

Pinus thunbergii Parl. non Lamb.: syn.: P. thunbergiana Franco.

Pisum sativum L.: in its modern sense, P. sativum L. includes P. arvense.  
Synonymy with P. elatius Stev., P. humile Boiss.

Platycodon grandiflorum (Jacq.) A. DC.: syn.: Campanula grandiflora Jacq.,  
Wahlenbergia grandiflora (Jacq.) Schrad. Botanical varieties thereof have  
also been given species names (in particular P. autumnale and P. chinensis).

Poa L.: synonymies with Dactylis, Eragrostis, Festuca, Glyceria, Koeleria,  
Puccinellia.

Polemonium L.: P. brandegeei has also been named Gilia brandegeei.

Polygonatum Mill.: syn.: Axillaria, Evallaria. Synonymies with Convallaria.

Polygonum L.: synonymies with Bilderdykia, Coccoloba, Fagopyrum, Muehlenbeckia,  
Reynoutria.

Poncirus Raf.: monotypic genus (P. trifoliata (L.) Raf.) which has the synonyms  
Citrus trifoliata L., Aegle sepiaria, Limonia trifoliata.

Potentilla L.: synonymies with Argentina, Comarum, Dasyphora, Drymocallis,  
Sibbaldiopsis.

Potentilla fruticosa L.: syn.: Dasyphora fruticosa. As the main table  
shows, certain types of cinquefoil are either considered to be sub-species of  
P. fruticosa L., or made into distinct species. Differences in the scope of  
application of protection result therefrom.

Protea spec.: synonymies with Aulax, Leucospermum, Paranomus, Serruria.

Prunus L.: this genus has been made into several genera by some botanists.  
The nomenclature most encountered in practice is the following:

- Amygdalus (almond)
- Armeniaca (apricot)
- Cerasus (cherry)
- Persica (peach)
- Prunus (plum).

As far as the species are concerned, the synonymies are given below. Certain  
States have defined the protected species by the indication of the genus  
Prunus L. followed by the common name of the species, in particular to avoid  
problems with nomenclature.

Prunus amygdalus Bartock: syn.: Amygdalus communis L., P. communis (L.)  
Arcang. non Huds.

Prunus armeniaca L.: syn.: Armeniaca vulgaris Lam.

Prunus avium (L.) L.: syn.: Cerasus avium (L.) Moench.

Prunus cerasifera Ehrh.: syn.: P. myrobalana Poit. et Turp., P. myrobalanus  
(L.) Loisel. The group of ornamental varieties of the Atropurpurea type is  
also known under the name P. pissardii Carr. In the States which rely mainly  
on common names, this species may or may not be protected depending on the  
interpretation of "plum."

Prunus cerasus L.: syn.: Cerasus vulgaris Mill. The sub-species and botanical  
varieties have also been made into species (P. acida K. Koch non Ehrh.; P. austera  
(L.) Ehrh., Cerasus austera (L.) Borkh.; Cerasus marasca Host, P. marasca  
(Host) Rchb.).

Prunus domestica L., Prunus insititia L.: classification of plums is extremely  
confused, as most botanists who have dealt with the genus Prunus have  
adopted their own system. On the species level, the most controversial question  
is whether P. insititia constitutes a species or should be considered a

subspecies of *P. domestica*. The latter is at present the most commonly recognized, but the former can still be found. In addition, there is controversy over the allocation of the various types of plums to the taxonomic entities that have been defined. For instance, mirabelle belongs to the entity (subspecies or species) *insititia* according to certain authors and to the entity *syriaca* according to others. The various types are not always used in the same manner from one country to another. For example, Damson is used solely as a rootstock in France, whereas in the United Kingdom it is also used as a fruiting species for pies, stewing and bottling. Finally, partly as a consequence of the different uses, types identified by a common name in one country may not have a common name in others; thus for example, there is no equivalent of Bullace in French. All these factors may influence the scope of application of protection.

Prunus fruticosa Pall.: syn.: *Cerasus fruticosa* (Pall.) Woron., *C. sylvestris*. In the States which rely mainly on common names, this species may be protected or not depending on the interpretation of "cherry."

Prunus glandulosa Thunb.: syn.: *P. sinensis*.

Prunus insititia L.: see under *P. domestica* L.

Prunus laurocerasus L.: syn.: *Laurocerasus officinalis* M.J. Roem., *Cerasus laurocerasus* (L.) Loisel.

Prunus lusitanica L.: syn.: *Cerasus lusitanica* (L.) Loisel.

Prunus persica (L.) Batsch: syn.: *Amygdalus persica* L., *A. pumila* Lour. non L., *Persica vulgaris*.

Prunus prostrata Labill.: syn.: *Cerasus prostrata*.

Prunus salicina Lindl.: syn.: *P. triflora*. In the States which rely mainly on common names, this species may or may not be protected depending on the interpretation of "plum."

Prunus tenella Batsch: syn.: *P. nana* (L.) Stokes non Du Roi, *Amygdalus nana* L.

Prunus triloba Lindl.: syn.: *Amygdalopsis lindleyi*.

Pseudocydonia sinensis Schneid.: syn.: *Chaenomeles sinensis*, *Cydonia sinensis* (Dum.-Cours.) Schneid.

Pseudotsuga Carr.: synonymies with *Abies*.

Psidium guajava L.: syn.: *P. pyriferum* L., *P. pomiferum* L.

Pulmonaria L.: *P. virginica* L. is a synonym of *Mertensia virginica* (L.) Pers.

Pyracantha M.J. Roem.: synonymies with *Cotoneaster*, *Crataegus*.

Pyrus L.: synonymies with *Amelanchier*, *Aronia*, *Chaenomeles*, *Cydonia*, *Malus*, *Mespilus*, *Sorbus*.

Pyrus communis L.: syn.: *P. domestica* Medik. non (L.) Ehrh. (according to Zander). The Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas considers the as a separate species, and *P. communis* Smith as a synonym of *Sorbus domestica* L.

Quamoclit Mill.: synonymies with *Calboa*, *Ipomoea*, *Mina*.

Quercus L.: synonymies with *Lithocarpus*.

Ranunculus L.: synonymies with *Batrachium*, *Callianthemum*, *Ceratocephalus*, *Ficaria*.

Ranunculus asiaticus L.: syn.: *R. hortensis* Pers., *R. africanus* hort.

Renanthera Lour.: see under *Orchidaceae*. Synonymies with *Aërides*, *Arachnis*, *Vanda*, *Vandopsis*.

Rhamnus L.: synonymies with Frangula, Oreokerogia, Ziziphus.

Rheum rhabarbarum L.: syn.: R. undulatum L. R. undulatum Pall. is a synonym of R. rhabonticum L.

Rhipsalidopsis Britt. et Rose: see under Epiphyllopsis...

Rhododendron L.: in its modern sense, this genus includes Azalea and Rhodora.

Rhodohypoxis baurii (Bak.) Nel: syn.: Hypoxis platypetala.

Rhus L.: synonymies with Cotinus, Toxicodendron.

Rhynchosystylis Bl.: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with Aerides, Saccobium.

Ribes niveum Lindl.: see under R. sylvestre. Syn.: R. gracile.

Ribes sylvestre (Lam.) Me t. et W. Koch: syn.: R. rubrum L. p.p. et auct. mult., R. vulgare Lam. p.p., R. sativum (Rchb.) Syme, R. rubrum ssp. vulgare (Lam.) Domin (according to Zander). Zander also maintains that most cultivated varieties derive from this species. According to the Dictionary of Gardening, the main ancestor of Red and White Currants is R. sativum, often wrongly called R. rubrum. Varieties of R. rubrum are cultivated in Scandinavia (Northern Red Currant). The Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas and Zander refer to this species under the name R. spicatum Robs. emend. Wilmoth (R. rubrum L. p.p., R. vulgare Lam. p.p., R. rubrum (L.) O. Schwarz, R. sylvestre Syme).

Ribes uva-crispa L.: according to Zander, the majority of cultivated varieties belong to the variety sativum DC., which has the synonym R. grossularia L. The Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas gives R. uva-crispa L. and R. grossularia L. as synonyms (and R. grossularia Wall. as a synonym of R. alpestris Wall.).

Robinia L.: synonymies with Tephrosia, Sesbania, Glicinidia.

Rohdea japonica (Thunb.) Roth: syn.: Orontium japonicum.

Rubus fruticosus L.: according to the Dictionary of Gardening, this term is a broad one and covers the blackberries. They have been divided by certain botanists into more than 100 species. The name does not appear in Zander.

Rubus idaeus L.: according to the Dictionary of Gardening, R. idaeus (wild raspberry) is the ancestor of cultivated raspberries. R. strigosus is the American counterpart of R. idaeus and has the synonym R. idaeus var. strigosus.

Rudbeckia L.: synonymies with Centrocarpha, Dracopis, Echinacea, Helianthus, Lepachys.

Ruta L.: synonymies with Haplophyllum.

Saccharum L.: synonymies with Gynerium, Rhynchelytrum.

Salvia L.: synonymies with Audibertia, Sclarea.

Salvia officinalis L.: the sub-species lavandulifolia (Vahl) Gams has also been made into a species (S. lavandulifolia Vahl).

Sansevieria Thunb.: S. hyacinthoides (L.) Druce has the synonym Aloe hyacinthoides L.

Saponaria L.: S. pumila has the synonym Silene pumila. S. vaccaria L. is a synonym of Vaccaria hispanica (Mill.) Rauschert (V. pyramidata Medik., V. vulgaris Host, V. segetalis Garcke, V. grandiflora (Fisch.) Jaub. et Spach).

Saxifraga L.: synonymies with Aceriphyllum, Bergenia, Boykinia, Chondrosa, Ciliaria, Leptasea, Peltiphyllum, Zahlbruckneri.

Scabiosa L.: synonymies with *Cephalaria*, *Knautia*, *Pterocephalus*, *Succisa*.

Schlumbergera Lem.: see under *Epiphyllopsis*...

Scilla L.: synonymies with *Barnardia*, *Dipcadi*, *Drimia*, *Endymion*, *Hyacinthoides*, *Hyacinthus*, *Lachenalia*, *Lebedouria*, *Urginea*.

Scindapsus Schott: synonymies with *Pothos*, *Raphidophora*.

Sedum L.: synonymies with *Byrnesia*, *Cotyledon*, *Crassula*, *Cremnophila*, *Echeveria*, *Gormania*, *Graptopetalum*, *Monanthes*, *Orostachys*, *Pistorinia*, *Rodiola*, *Rosularia*, *Sinocrassula*, *Umbilicus*.

Selaginella P. Beauv.: *S. cuspidata* var. *elongata* has the synonym *Lycopodium cordifolium*.

Senecio cruentus (L'Hér.) DC.: syn.: *Cineraria cruenta* DC.

Serruria spec.: synonymies with *Protea*.

Setaria italicica (L.) Beauv.: syn.: *Panicum italicum* L.

Sesamum indicum L.: syn.: *S. orientale* L.

Sidalcea A. Gray: *S. malvaeflora* has the synonyms *Callirhoe spicata*, *Sida malvaeflora*.

Silene L.: synonymies with *Agrostemma*, *Cucubalus*, *Eudianthe*, *Heliosperma*, *Lychnis*, *Melandrium*, *Saponaria*, *Viscaria*.

Sinningia Nees: synonymies with *Gloxinia*, *Rosanowia*, *Stenogaster*, *Tapeionites*.

Sisyrinchium L.: synonymies with *Eleutherine*, *Marica*, *Olsynium*, *Solenomelus*.

Solanum L.: synonymies with *Cyphomandra*, *Lycopersicon*.

Solanum melongena L.: syn.: *S. aethiopicum* Thunb., *S. incanum* L.

Solanum tuberosum L.: syn.: *S. andigenum* Juz. et Buk.

Solidago L.: *S. graminifolia* has the synonym *Euthamia graminifolia*, its variety *nuttallii*, *E. nuttallii* and *S. rigida* has the synonym *Oligoneuron rigidum*.

Sophora L.: synonymies with *Edwardsia*.

Sophronitis Lindl.: see under *Orchidaceae*. *S. cernua* has the synonym *Sophronia cernua*. *S. violacea* Lindl. has the synonyms *Sophronitella violacea* (Lindl.) Schlechter, *Cattleya violacea* (Lindl.) Beer non Rolfe nec hort.

Sorbus L.: synonymies with *Aronia*, *Crataegus*, *Micromeles*, *Pyrus*.

Sorghum Moench: synonymies with *Andropogon*, *Holcus*, *Millium*, *Panicum*.

Sorghum dochna (Forssk.) Snowden: syn.: *S. vulgare* var. *saccharatum* (Moench) Boerl., *S. bicolor* (L.) Moench ssp. *bicolor*.

Sorghum vulgare Pers.: main synonym: *S. bicolor* (L.) Moench. According to the *Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas*, this species contains all annual cultivated types, whereas Zander distinguishes several species.

Spartium L.: *S. junceum* L. has the synonyms *Genista juncea*, *G. odorata*. *S. scoparium* L. is a synonym of *Sarothamnus scoparius* (L.) Wimm.

Spathiphyllum spec.: synonymies with *Anthurium*, *Pothos*, *Rhodospatha*.

Stachys L.: synonymies with *Betonica*.

Stevia rebaudiana (Bertoni) Hemsl.: syn.: *Eupatorium rebaudianum*.

Stewartia L.: syn.: Stuartia L'Hér. S. ovata has also the synonym Malacodendron pentagynum.

Stranvaesia Lindl.: S. davidiana has also been described as Photinia davidianna.

Symporicarpos Duham.: S. rivularis has also been described as Symphoria racemosa.

Syringa L.: synonymies with Ligustrina.

Tamarix L.: T. germanica L. is a synonym of Myricaria germanica (L.) Desv.

Tecoma Juss.: synonymies with Bignonia, Campsidium, Campsis, Pandorea, Podranea, Stenolobium, Tecomaria, Tecomella.

Teucrium chamaedrys L.: T. chamaedrys hort. is perhaps a synonym of T. massiliense L.

Teucrium fruticans L.: syn.: T. latifolium.

Thalictrum L.: synonymies with Anemonella, Isopyrum.

Thea sinensis L.: syn.: Camellia sinensis (L.) O. Kuntze (name stabilized by ISTA), T. viridis L., T. bohea L., C. thea Link, C. theifera Griff.

Thuja L.: synonymies with Biota, Platycladus, Tetraclinis, Thujopsis.

Thuja orientalis L.: syn.: Biota orientalis (L.) Endl., Platycladus orientalis (L.) Franco, P. stricta Spach.

Tiarella L.: T. menziesii is a synonym of Tolmiea menziesii.

Tillandsia L.: synonymies with Allardtia, Anoplophytum, Billbergia, Catopsis, Cryptanthus, Phytarrhiza, Platystachis, Pourretia, Streptocalyx, Vriesea, Wallisia.

Tradescantia L.: synonymies with Aneilema, Commelina, Dichorisandra, Gibasis, Hadrodemas, Phyodina, Pyrrheima, Rhoeo, Spironema, Zebrina.

Trifolium repens L.: syn.: T. nigrescens Schur [non Viv.].

Trifolium resupinatum L.: T. resupinatum Less. is a synonym of T. fragiferum L.

Triisetum flavescens (L.) Beauv.: syn.: Avena flavescens L.

Triticum L.: synonymies with Agropyron.

Triticum aestivum L.: syn.: T. hybernnum L., T. sativum Lam., T. vulgare Vill., T. cereale Schrank (according to Zander). In the Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas, classification is based on T. aestivum (L.) Thell. (syn.: T. aestivum L.), which groups units that are made into species in Zander (in particular T. macha Dekapr. et Menabde, T. spelta L., T. sphaerococcum Perciv.).

Triticum durum Desf.: syn.: T. turgidum (L.) Thell. ssp. turgidum convar. durm (Desf.) Mac Kay.

Triticum spelta L.: syn.: T. aestivum (L.) Thell. ssp. spelta (L.) Thell.

Tritonia Ker-Gawl.: synonymies with Acidanthera, Crocosmia, Dichone, Gladiolus, Ixia, Montbretia.

Trollius L.: T. lilacinus has the synonym Hegemone lilacina.

Vaccinium L.: synonymies with Agapetes, Andromeda, Batodendron, Cyanococcus, Epigynium, Herpothamnus, Hugeria, Oxycoccoides, Oxycoccus, Polycodium, Thibaudia, Vitis-idaea.

Valerianella locusta (L.) Laterrade: syn.: V. olitoria (L.) Poll.

Vanda Jones: see under Orchidaceae. Synonymies with Acampe, Aërides, Anota, Arachnanthe, Esmeralda, Euanthe, Luisia, Phalaenopsis, Renanthera, Rhynchosystylis, Saccolabium, Sarcanthus, Stauropsis, Vandopsis.

Veratrum L.: V. viride has also been described under the name Helonias viride.

Verbena L.: synonymies with Junellia, Lippia.

Veronica L.: the genera Hebe, Paederota, Veronicastrum are either included in Veronica, or separated.

Viburnum L.: V. rigidum has the synonym Tinus rugosus.

Vicia articulata Hornem.: syn.: V. monantha Desf., Ervum monanthum L.

Vicia faba L.: syn.: Faba bona Medik., F. vulgaris Moench.

Vicia sativa L.: the sub-species nigra (L.) Ehrh. (angustifolia (L.) Aschers. et Graebn.) also has the synonym V. angustifolia L.

Vicia villosa Roth: according to ISTA, this species includes V. dasycarpa Ten. The Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas considers them as synonyms.

Vigna unguiculata (L.) Walp.: synonym other than that indicated in the main table: Dolichos biflorus L. According to the Diccionario de Plantas Agricolas and Zander, the sub-species have the following synonymies:

- ssp. cylindrica (L.) Van Eseltine ex Verdc.: V. catjang (Burm. f.) Walp., V. cylindrica (L.) Skeels, Phaseolus cylindricus Stickm.;  
- ssp. sesquipedalis (L.) Verdc.: V. sesquipedalis (L.) Fruwirth, Dolichos sesquipedalis L.;  
- ssp. unguiculata: Dolichos sinensis Stickm.

Vinca L.: V. rosea L. is frequently separated from Vinca under the name Catharanthus roseus.

Viola L.: V. hederacea has also been described under the names Erpetion reniforme and E. hederaceum.

Vitis L.: the genera Ampelopsis, Cissus, Columella, Parthenocissus and Tetrastigma have been included in the genus Vitis by certain botanists, particularly by Bentham and Hooker in their Genera Plantarum. A great number of synonymies resulting from this conception are still in use. Other synonymies are due to the fact that certain species have been classified in two or three, or even four of the above-mentioned genera. Other synonymies with Muscadinia, Pterisanthes, Spinovitis.

Vriesea Lindl. corr. Beer: synonymies with Encholirion, Guzmania, Massangea, Tillandsia.

Vriesea splendens (Brongn.) Lem.: synonymies with V. speciosa, Tillandsia vittata, T. zebrina. V. splendens var. major hort. Duval. is a synonym of V. longibracteata (Bak.) Mez.

X Vuylstekeara hort.: see under Orchidaceae. Hybrids Cochlioda X Miltonia X Odontoglossum.

Weigela Thunb.: see under Diervilla Mill.

Wysteria Nutt.: synonymies with Glycine, Millettia, Wistaria.

Yucca L.: synonymies with Dasyllirion, Furcraea, Hesperaloë, Hesperoyucca, Nolina.

Yucca aloifolia L.: Y. draconis is a synonym of Y. aloifolia var. draconis.

Yucca baccata Torr.: syn.: Y. circinata. Y. baccata var. australis is a synonym of Y. torreyi Shafer (Y. macrocarpa (Torr.) Coville non Engelm.).

Yucca whipplei Torr.: syn.: Hesperoyucca whipplei (Torr.) Bak.

Zantedeschia Spreng.: synonymies with Calla, Richardia.

Zelkova Spach: syn.: Abelicia. Synonymies with Hemiptelea, Ulmus.

Zygocactus K. Schum.: see under Epiphyllopsis...
