Comments from New Zealand on the following draft Explanatory Notes July 2014

UPOV/INF/12/5 Draft 1Explanatory Notes on Variety Denominations

Paragraph 2

The current notes are silent on the use of a Latin name or a common name as part of a denomination for a variety of that genus. The use of a denomination which includes the name of the genus or common name for that variety might lead to confusion.

Article 19.23 and 19.24 of ICNCP 7th edition provide further information.

A new 2.3.1 (d)

(d) contain the Latin or common name of the genus to which that variety belongs. The identity of the denomination and that of the genus to which it belongs could become unclear and confusing.

Example: *Carex* variety 'Sedge'. This could possibly be referred to as 'Sedge' *Carex* and without the use of italics or single quotes the identity of the denomination and the genus may not be clear.

UPOV/INF/PPM Draft 2 Explanatory notes on Propagation and Propagating Material

Paragraph 3

Propagation technology continues to change rapidly and techniques not previously applied to the propagation of a genus or species are now being applied. Paragraph 3. (i) and (iii) cover what has been done with respect to tradition and accepted practice but the current text does not cover recent developments and the future practice.

An example. A variegated foliage plant was traditionally propagated by division. To do this you need whole plants or plantlets. With the development of *in vitro* technology it is now possible to propagate from cut leaves. Working through 3 (i) – (v) we may come to the conclusion that a leaf is not propagating material but considering very recent developments now is.

The paragraph could be improved by adding:

(vi) whether the material is subject to recent developments in propagation technology or change in custom/practice

UPOV/EXN/CAN/2 draft 1 Explanatory notes on Cancellation of the Breeders Right

6.of the breeder's right. *Cancellation is a decision and action of the granting authority in contrast to* surrender or renunciation.....

It is important to emphasise that cancellation is an official action of the authority where surrender is voluntary and entirely the responsibility of the title holder.
